A BILL

To amend section 307.12 of the Revised Code to1authorize boards of county commissioners to dispose2of unneeded, obsolete, or unfit county personal3property by Internet auction.4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 307.12 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 307.12. (A) Except as otherwise provided in division 7 divisions (B), (C), and (E) of this section, when the board of 8 county commissioners finds, by resolution, that the county has 9 personal property, including motor vehicles acquired for the use 10 of county officers and departments, and road machinery, equipment, 11 tools, or supplies, which is not needed for public use, or is 12 obsolete or unfit for the use for which it was acquired, and when 13 the fair market value of the property to be sold under this 14 division is, in the opinion of the board, in excess of two 15 thousand five hundred dollars, the board may do either of the 16

following:

(1) Sell such the property at public auction or by sealed bid 18 to the highest bidder. Notice of the time, place, and manner of 19 the sale shall also be published in a newspaper of general 20 circulation in the county at least ten days prior to the sale, and 21 a typewritten or printed notice of the time, place, and manner of 22 the sale shall be posted at least ten days before the sale in the 23 offices of the county auditor and the board of county 24 commissioners. 25

If a board conducts a sale of personal property by sealed bid, the form of the bid shall be as prescribed by the board, and each bid shall contain the name of the person submitting it. Bids received shall be opened and tabulated at the time stated in the notice. The property shall be sold to the highest bidder, except that the board may reject all bids and hold another sale, by public auction or sealed bid, in the manner prescribed by this section.

(2) Donate any motor vehicle that does not exceed four 34 thousand five hundred dollars in value to a nonprofit organization 35 exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to 26 U.S.C. 501(a) 36 and (c)(3) for the purpose of meeting the transportation needs of 37 participants in the Ohio works first program established under 38 Chapter 5107. of the Revised Code and participants in the 39 prevention, retention, and contingency program established under 40 Chapter 5108. of the Revised Code. 41

(B) When the board of county commissioners finds, by
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resolution, that the county has personal property, including motor
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vehicles acquired for the use of county officers and departments,
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and road machinery, equipment, tools, or supplies, which is not
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needed for public use, or is obsolete or unfit for the use for
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which it was acquired, and when the fair market value of the
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property to be sold under this division is, in the opinion of the

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board, two thousand five hundred dollars or less, the board may sell the property by private sale, without advertisement or public notification.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in division divisions (A) or (C) of this section and regardless of the property's value, the board may sell or donate <u>county</u> personal property, including motor vehicles, of the county to the federal government, the state, or any political subdivision of the state without advertisement or public notification.

(C) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in divisions 58 (A), (B), or (E) of this section and regardless of the property's 59 value, the board of county commissioners may sell personal 60 property, including motor vehicles acquired for the use of county 61 officers and departments, and road machinery, equipment, tools, or 62 supplies, which is not needed for public use, or is obsolete or 63 unfit for the use for which it was acquired, by internet auction. 64 The board shall adopt, during each calendar year, a resolution 65 expressing its intent to sell that property by internet auction. 66 The resolution shall include a description of how the auctions 67 will be conducted and shall specify the number of days for bidding 68 on the property, which shall be no less than fifteen, including 69 Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays. The resolution shall 70 indicate whether the board will designate a representative to 71 conduct the auction and shall establish the general terms and 72 conditions of sale. If a representative designee is known when the 73 resolution is adopted, the resolution shall provide contact 74 information such as the designee's name, address, and telephone 75 number 76

After adoption of the resolution, the board shall publish77notice, in a newspaper of general circulation in the county, of78its intent to sell unneeded, obsolete, or unfit county personal79property by internet auction. The notice shall include a summary80

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of the information provided in the resolution and shall be	81
published at least twice. The second and any subsequent notice	82
shall be published not less than ten nor more than twenty days	83
after the previous notice. A similar notice also shall be posted	84
continually throughout the calendar year in a conspicuous place in	85
the offices of the county auditor and the board of county	86
commissioners, and, if the county maintains a website on the	87
internet, the notice shall be posted continually throughout the	88
calendar year at that website.	89

When property is to be sold by internet auction, the board or 90 its designated representative may establish a minimum price that 91 will be <u>accepted for specific items and may establish any other</u> 92 terms and conditions for the particular sale, including 93 requirements for pick-up or delivery, method of payment, and sales 94 tax. This type of information shall be provided on the internet at 95 the time of the auction and may be provided before that time upon 96 request after the terms and conditions have been determined by the 97 board or its designated representative. 98

(D) When a county officer or department head determines that 99 county-owned personal property under the jurisdiction of the 100 officer or department head, including motor vehicles, road 101 machinery, equipment, tools, or supplies, is not of immediate 102 need, the county officer or department head may notify the board 103 of county commissioners, and the board may lease such that 104 personal property to any municipal corporation, township, or other 105 political subdivision of the state. Such The lease shall require 106 the county to be reimbursed under terms, conditions, and fees 107 established by the board of county commissioners, or under 108 contracts executed by the board. 109

(D) Where (E) If the board of county commissioners finds, by 110 resolution, that the county has vehicles, equipment, or machinery 111 which is not needed, or is unfit for public use, and the board 112

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desires to sell such <u>the</u> vehicles, equipment, or machinery to the 113 person or firm from which it proposes to purchase other vehicles, 114 equipment, or machinery, the board may offer to sell the vehicles, 115 equipment, or machinery to such <u>that</u> person or firm, and to have 116 such <u>the</u> selling price credited to the person or firm against the 117 purchase price of other vehicles, equipment, or machinery. 118

(E) Where (F) If the board of county commissioners advertises 120 for bids for the sale of new vehicles, equipment, or machinery to 121 the county, it may include in the same advertisement a notice of 122 the willingness of such the board to accept bids for the purchase 123 of county-owned vehicles, equipment, or machinery which is 124 obsolete or not needed for public use, and to have the amount of 125 such those bids subtracted from the selling price of the other 126 vehicles, equipment, or machinery as a means of determining the 127 lowest responsible bidder. 128

(G) As used in this section, "internet" means the129international computer network of both federal and nonfederal130interoperable packet switched data networks, including the131graphical subnetwork called the world wide web.132

Section 2. That existing section 307.12 of the Revised Code 133 is hereby repealed.

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
