BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 2721.16 of the Revised Code be	8	
amended to read as follows:		
Sec. 2721.16. (A)(1) A court of record shall not award	10	
attorney's fees to any party on a claim or proceeding for	11	
declaratory relief under this chapter unless a <u>any of the</u>	12	
following applies:		
(a) A section of the Revised Code explicitly authorizes a	14	
court of record to award attorney's fees on a claim for	15	
declaratory relief under this chapter or unless an<u>.</u>	16	
(b) An award of attorney's fees is authorized by section	17	
2323.51 of the Revised Code, by the Civil Rules, or by an award of		
punitive or exemplary damages against the party ordered to pay		
attorney's fees. References		

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(c) Regardless of whether a claim for declaratory relief is	21
granted under this chapter, a court of record awards attorney's	22
fees to a fiduciary, beneficiary, or other interested party, the	23
attorney's fees are to be paid out of trust property, estate	24
property, or other property that is the subject of a fiduciary	25
relationship and that is involved in that claim or proceeding for	26
declaratory relief, and the attorney's fees are awarded in	
accordance with equitable principles that permit recovery of	28
attorney's fees incurred for services that are beneficial to the	29
trust or estate.	30

(2) References in another section of the Revised Code to an award of costs or expenses incurred in connection with an action or proceeding does not authorize an award of attorney's fees for purposes of this division (A)(1) of this section.

(B) Consistent with section 2721.13 of the Revised Code, the 35 provisions of this section are remedial in nature. Notwithstanding 36 any provision of the Revised Code in existence on the day 37 immediately prior to the effective date of this section <u>September</u> 38 24, 1999, notwithstanding any judicial construction prior to the 39 effective date of this section <u>September 24, 1999</u>, of a statutory 40 provision of that nature, notwithstanding the holding in any 41 decision of a court of this state, other than a decision based on 42 equitable principles described in division (A)(1)(c) of this 43 section, that authorized an award of attorney's fees to a party to 44 a civil action or proceeding based on common law grounds rather 45 than a statutory authorization of the general assembly, regardless 46 of the date upon which a cause of action accrued that pertains to 47 an action or proceeding in which declaratory relief is sought 48 under this chapter, and regardless of who is the plaintiff or the 49 defendant in an action or proceeding in which declaratory relief 50 is sought under this chapter, division (A) of this section shall 51 apply in connection with both of the following: 52

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(1) An action or proceeding that is commenced on or after the	53	
effective date of this section <u>September 24, 1999,</u> and that seeks	54	
declaratory relief under this chapter;		
(2) An action or proceeding that was commenced prior to the	56	
effective date of this section <u>September 24, 1999</u> , that is pending		
in a court of record on that date, and that seeks declaratory		
relief under this chapter.		
Section 2. That existing section 2721.16 of the Revised Code	60	
is hereby repealed.		

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
