BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Sec. 733.262. (A) In lieu of having the elected office of 9 village clerk and the office of village treasurer, or the combined 10 elected office of village clerk-treasurer, a village may combine 11 the duties of the clerk and treasurer into one appointed office, 12 to be known as the village fiscal officer. To make this change, 13 the village legislative authority shall pass, by a two-thirds 14 vote, an ordinance or resolution proposing to make the change 15 effective on the first day of January following the next regular 16

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municipal election at which the village clerk or village	17
