A BILL

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Notwithstanding section 3317.01 of the Revised 6 Code, no school district shall be denied payments under Chapter 7 3317. of the Revised Code for fiscal year 2002 if any school in 8 the district was open for instruction during fiscal year 2001 for 9 fewer days than required by sections 3313.48, 3313.481, and 10 3317.01 of the Revised Code, provided that the reason any such 11 school was not open for the required number of days was to prevent 12 the spread of meningococcal disease. 13

Section 2. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency 14 measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 15 peace, health, and safety. The reason for the necessity is that 16 immediate action is necessary to avoid delays in fiscal year 2002 17 payments to school districts that exceeded the number of permitted 18 calamity days in fiscal year 2001 because of an unforeseen need to 19 close schools to prevent the spread of meningococcal disease. 20 Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect. 21
