Sec. 4725.40. As used in sections 4725.40 to 4725.59 of the Revised Code:

(A) "Optical aid" means an <u>a fabricated opthalmic instrument</u>, 15
<u>accessory, item, procedure</u>, or device prescribed by <u>designed based</u> 16
<u>on a prescription or written or verbal instructions of</u> a physician 17
or optometrist licensed by any state to correct human vision, 18
including spectacles, eyeglasses, contact lenses, and accessories. 19
<u>Contact lenses shall be dispensed only in accordance with a</u> 20

Sec. 4725.42. (A) There is hereby created the Ohio optical 121 dispensers board, consisting of nine members: 122

(1) Five dispensing opticians, at least one of whom shall be 123 a contact lens dispensing optician and at least one of whom shall 124 be a spectacle dispensing optician, licensed under sections 125 4725.48 to 4725.51 of the Revised Code, except as otherwise 126 provided in this division; 127

(2) One physician licensed by the state medical board who 128 engages in the practice of ophthalmology; 129

(3) One optometrist licensed by the state board of optometry; 130

(4) Two members of the public who have no direct financial 132 interest in or any other interest in the provision of optical 133 aids, eye prosthetics, or the performance of optical dispensing or 134 ocularistry services. At least one of these members of the public 135 shall be at least sixty years of age. 136

The initial dispensing optician members of the board shall 137 meet the criteria for licensure as licensed dispensing opticians 138 specified in section 4725.47 of the Revised Code. 139

(B) The governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, 140 shall make appointments to the board. Terms of office shall be for 141

five years, each term commencing on the twenty-third day of March 142 and ending on the twenty-second day of March. Each member of the 143 board shall hold office from the date of his appointment until the 144 end of the term for which he the member was appointed, except that 145 if a successor member has not been appointed by the end of the 146 term, the member shall continue in office until such appointment. 147

No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms. Any 149 vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of a member's term shall 150 be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A member 151 appointed to fill a vacancy shall hold office for the remainder of 152 the unexpired term of the predecessor member of the board. 153

sec. 4725.44. (A) The Ohio optical dispensers board shall be 154 responsible for the administration of sections 4725.40 to 4725.59 155 of the Revised Code and, in particular, Those responsibilities 156 shall process include processing applications for licensure as 157 licensed dispensing opticians and ocularists; processing 158 apprentice and optical intern registration forms; schedule 159 scheduling, administer administering, and supervise supervising 160 the qualifying examinations for licensure; issuing licenses 161 to qualified individuals; revoke registering apprentices and 162 optical interns; revoking and suspend suspending licenses and 163 registrations; and maintain maintaining adequate records with 164 respect to its operations and responsibilities. Pursuant to 165 investigations of violations of sections 4725.40 to 4725.59 of the 166 Revised Code, the board may issue subpoenas and subpoenas duces 167 tecum as well as conduct depositions. 168

(B) The board shall adopt, amend, or rescind rules, pursuant

to Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, for the licensure of

dispensing opticians and ocularists, the registration of

apprentices and optical interns, and such other rules as are

required by or necessary to carry out the responsibilities imposed

(C) The board shall have no authority to adopt rules
governing the employment of dispensing opticians, the location or
number of optical stores, advertising of optical products or

services, or the manner in which such products can be displayed.

Sec. 4725.45. (A) The Ohio optical dispensers board shall 179 employ an executive secretary-treasurer, who shall serve at the 180 pleasure of the board. Before entering upon the discharge of the 181 duties imposed upon the executive secretary-treasurer by sections 182 4725.40 to 4725.59 of the Revised Code or by the board, the 183 executive secretary-treasurer shall give a bond, with sufficient 184 sureties, in an amount to be determined by the board for the 185 faithful discharge of the duties of the office of executive 186 secretary-treasurer. The premium for such bond shall be paid as 187 are other expenditures of the board. Such bond, with the approval 188 of the board and oath of office endorsed thereon, shall be 189 deposited with the secretary of state and kept in the secretary of 190 state's office. 191

(B) The executive secretary-treasurer shall perform such duties as are prescribed by the board.

(C) The board may employ such additional employees as may be

(D) All receipts of the board shall be deposited in the state
treasury to the credit of the occupational licensing and
regulatory fund. All vouchers of the board shall be approved by
the president of the board and the executive secretary-treasurer.

(E) The board, subject to the approval of the controlling
board, may establish examination and license renewal fees in
excess of the amounts provided in sections 4725.48, 4725.49,
4725.47 and 4725.51 of the Revised Code, provided that such fees

Sec. 4725.47. (A) Within one year from the effective date of 206 this section, Except as provided in section 4725.57 of the Revised 207 <u>Code</u>, any person who has or is engaged desires to engage in 208 optical dispensing and who desires to continue or recommence the 209 practice of optical dispensing without having to satisfy the 210 requirements of sections 4725.48 to 4725.50 of the Revised Code, 211 shall submit a properly completed written application on an 212 approved form, accompanied by a fee of fifty dollars, to the Ohio 213 optical dispensers board. The application shall contain 214 information sufficient to establish that the applicant: 215

(1) Is at least eighteen years of age*;*

(2) Is of good moral character, as defined by rules adopted 217 under division (B) of section 4725.44 of the Revised Code; 218

(3) Is free of contagious or infectious disease, as defined219by rules adopted under division (B) of section 4725.44 of the220Revised Code;221

(4) Is a graduate of an accredited high school of any state,222or has received an education equivalent thereto; and223

(5) Has successfully completed a course, as prescribed by 224 225 board rule, in a school for optical dispensing education approved by the board, or has had at least one year of optical dispensing 226 227 experience, as prescribed by rule of the board, or has completed a 228 combination of such prescribed schooling and experience, as prescribed by rule of the board. The applicant shall submit 229 sufficient proof, as determined by rule of the board, of the 230 231 completion of such schooling or experience.

(B) If an application submitted under division (A) of this232section establishes that the applicant meets the criteria set233forth therein, the board shall license the applicant as a licensed234

dispensing optician of the state. Such licensee shall be235designated as a spectacle dispensing optician, contact lens236dispensing optician, or spectacle-contact lens dispensing237optician, in accordance with the requirements of sections 4725.40238to 4725.59 of the Revised Code.239

(C) Any license issued under this section shall be renewed in240accordance with section 4725.51 of the Revised Code. or241ocularistry must apply to the Ohio optical dispensers board to be242licensed as a dispensing optician or ocularist pursuant to243sections 4725.40 to 4725.59 of the Revised Code. Application must244be made on the form provided by the board and must be accompanied245by an application fee the board shall establish by rule.246

(B) The board shall issue a license to practice optical 247 dispensing or ocularistry, without the necessity of examination, 248 to any person who was employed by an optometrist or physician on 249 the effective date of this section and for the entire year 250 preceding that date and who practiced and desires to continue 251 practicing optical dispensing or ocularistry, if the person, no 252 later than one year after the effective date of this section, does 253 all of the following: 254

(1) Submits an application for licensure on a form provided by the board;

(2) Provides or causes to be provided a certification from257the employing optometrist or physician that the person was258employed on the effective date of this section and the year prior259to that date and that the person practiced optical dispensing or260ocularistry;261

(3) Pays the application fee described in this section. 262

Sec. 4725.51. (A)(1) Each license issued under sections 396 4725.40 to 4725.59 of the Revised Code shall expire on the first 397 day of January in the year after it was issued. Each person 398 holding a valid, current license may apply to the Ohio optical 399 dispensers board for the extension of the license under the 400 standard renewal procedures of Chapter 4745. of the Revised Code. 401 Each application for renewal shall be accompanied by a renewal fee 402 the board shall establish by rule and shall contain evidence that 403 the applicant has completed a continuing education program within 404 the immediately preceding one-year period as follows: 405

(1) Licensed spectacle (a) Spectacle dispensing opticians shall have pursued four hours of study in spectacle dispensing, approved by the board $\dot{\tau}$

(2) Licensed contact.
