Sec. 4511.451. (A) As used in this section, "funeral	9
procession" means two or more vehicles accompanying a body of a	10
deceased person in the daytime when each of such the vehicles has	
its headlights lighted and is displaying a purple and white or an	12
orange and white pennant attached to each vehicle in such a manner	
as to be clearly visible to traffic approaching from any	14
direction.
