A BILL

To allocate funds from the State Capital Improvements Fund in the form of grants for approved projects enhancing Amish buggy safety on Ohio's roadways.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) Notwithstanding the allocations established in division (B) of section 164.08 of the Revised Code, for each of the two program years commencing after the effective date of this section, the Director of the Ohio Public Works Commission first shall allocate \$2,500,000 of the net proceeds of obligations paid into the State Capital Improvements Fund among counties, municipal corporations, and townships having Amish communities located 10 within their boundaries. The amounts allocated shall be used to 11 make grants for eligible projects improving Amish buggy safety on 12 roadways in accordance with this section. 13

(B) Any of the following types of projects are eligible for grants under this section:

(1) Constructing or widening shoulders, including widening of bridges and culverts and purchase of rights-of-way, if necessary;

(2) Constructing pull-off lanes for roadways with visibility issues;

(3) Improving vertical and horizontal curvature of roadways; 21 (4) Placement of warning signs for buggy traffic, including 22 automated flashing signs; 23 (5) Studies to determine and establish appropriate reduced 24 speed limits; 25 (6) Programs to increase buggy visibility; 26 27 (7) Other projects identified as enhancing Amish buggy safety on Ohio's roadways. 28 (C)(1) The Director may require the use of the procedures 29 established in Chapter 164. of the Revised Code or may establish 30 alternative procedures for making applications and for reviewing, 31 approving, and rejecting projects for which assistance is 32 authorized under this section. 33 (2) The Director may require municipal corporations and 34 townships to cooperate with the county in which they are located 35 and prioritize the projects for which assistance is requested 36 under this section. 37 (3) The Director shall prioritize project approval based on 38 the greatest potential for improved safety at locations with a 39 pattern of accidents between buggies and motor vehicles. 40 (D) In evaluating a request for financial assistance under 41 Chapter 164. of the Revised Code, neither a District Public Works 42 Integrating Committee nor the Director shall deny a request of a 43 municipal corporation, township, or county on the grounds that it 44 45 had received a grant under this section.
