A BILL

To enact section 3313.614 of the Revised Code to grant high school diplomas to World War II veterans, and to make an appropriation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3313.614 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:

Sec. 3313.614. (A)(1) Notwithstanding the requirements of sections 3313.61, 3313.611, and 3313.612 of the Revised Code, the board of education of any city, exempted village, or local school

district or the governing authority of any chartered nonpublic	9
school may grant a high school diploma to any World War II veteran	10
who is a resident of this state if all of the following apply:	11

<u>(a) The veteran left a public or nonpublic school located in</u>	12
