A BILL

To enact section 1514.081 of the Revised Code to	1
require the Chief of the Division of Mineral	2
Resources Management in the Department of Natural	3
Resources to adopt rules governing the beneficial	4
use of lime mining wastes.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 1514.081 of the Revised Code be	6
enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 1514.081. (A) As used in this section:	8
(1) "Lime mining wastes" means residual solid or semisolid	9
materials generated from lime or limestone mining and processing	10
operations, including, without limitation, lime kiln dust,	11
scrubber sludge from lime kiln operations, lime or limestone	12
materials not meeting product specification, lime hydrating	13
materials, and other lime or limestone mining, processing, or	14
calcining materials associated with lime or limestone mining or	15
processing.	16
(2) "Beneficial use" means the use of lime mining wastes for	17
land application for land that is reclaimed in accordance with	18
this chapter and rules adopted under it, including, but not	19
limited to, use as fill material in guarries, and any other	20

purposes designated by the chief of the division of mineral	21
resources management, including demonstration projects approved by	22
the chief.	23
(3) "Solid waste disposal facility" means a facility for the	24
disposal of solid wastes that is licensed under Chapter 3734. of	25
the Revised Code.	26
(4) "Disposal system" has the same meaning as in section	27
6111.01 of the Revised Code.	28
(B) The chief may adopt, amend, and rescind rules in	29
accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code establishing	30
standards and requirements for the beneficial use of lime mining	31
wastes, including the beneficial use of lime mining wastes at lime	32
mining and reclamation operations governed by this chapter. The	33
beneficial use of lime mining wastes is subject to any applicable	34
standards and requirements established under this chapter and	35
rules adopted it.	36
(C) The beneficial use of lime mining wastes does not	37
constitute establishing a solid waste disposal facility or a	38
disposal system. A beneficial use of lime mining wastes that is	39
authorized under this section is not subject to any of the	40
<u>following:</u>	41
(1) Permit and license requirements for solid waste	42
facilities established under sections 3734.02 and 3734.05 of the	43
Revised Code;	44
(2) The prohibition against open dumping of solid wastes	45
established under section 3734.03 of the Revised Code;	46
(3) Solid waste disposal and generation fees established	47
under sections 3734.57 to 3734.574 of the Revised Code;	48
(4) Permit to install and plan approval requirements and	49
prohibitions established under sections 6111.03, 6111.04, 6111.44,	50

and 6111.45 of the Revised Code.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit any other	52
requirements that are applicable to the beneficial use of lime	53
mining wastes under Chapter 3704., 3714., 3734., or 6111. of the	54
Revised Code or any local or federal laws, including, without	55
limitation, requirements governing air pollution control permits,	56
hazardous waste installation and operation permits, national	57
pollutant discharge elimination system permits, and section 401	58
water quality certifications.	59
