# A BILL

То	amend section 5.01 and to enact sections 5.012 and	1
	5.013 of the Revised Code to establish requirements	2
	governing the display and disposal of the state	3
	flag, to explain the symbolism of the state flag,	4
	and to adopt an official pledge to the state flag.	5

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

	Section	1.	That	sect	ion	5.01	be	amer	ided	and	sec	ctions	5.01	L2
an	d 5.013 of	the	e Revi	sed	Code	be	enac	cted	to	read	as	follow	vs:	

Sec. 5.01. The flag of the state shall be pennant shaped. It shall have three red and two white horizontal stripes that represent the roads and waterways of the state. The union of the flag shall be seventeen five-pointed stars, white in a blue triangular field that represents the state's hills and valleys, the base of which shall be the staff end or vertical edge of the flag, and the apex of which shall be the center of the middle red stripe. The stars shall be grouped around a red disc superimposed upon a white circular "O." The thirteen stars grouped around the "O" represent the original states of the United States and the four stars added to the peak of the triangle symbolize that Ohio was the seventeenth state admitted to the union. The "O" represents the "O" in "Ohio" and suggests the state's nickname,

the buckeye state. The proportional dimensions of the flag and of	21				
its various parts shall be according to the official design on					
file in the office of the secretary of state. One state flag of	23				
uniform dimensions shall be furnished to each company of the					
organized militia.	25				
Sec. 5.012. (A) Display of the state flag at all state	26				
buildings and public institutions, such as public school buildings	27				
and state parks, is encouraged. If the state flag is displayed, it	28				
may be flown every day when weather permits and shall be flown	29				
from sunrise until sunset on all national and state holidays and	30				
on any other days that the governor proclaims. The state flag may	31				
be flown at night when properly lighted. When the state flag is	32				
displayed outdoors, it shall be flown either from a flagpole or a	33				
staff. Any staff from which the state flag is flown shall be at	34				
least two and one-half times as long as the state flag.	35				
(B) When the state flag and the United States flag are	36				
displayed at the same time, they shall be approximately the same	37				
size, and the state flag shall not be larger than the United	38				
States flag. When the state flag and the United States flag are	39				
displayed together against a wall from crossed staffs, the state	40				
flag shall be on the left of the United States flag, and the staff	41				
supporting the state flag shall be behind the staff supporting the	42				
United States flag. When the state flag is flown from the same	43				
halyard as the United States flag, the state flag shall be	44				
displayed beneath the United States flag. When the state flag is	45				
carried in a procession in which the United States flag is	46				
unfurled, the state flag shall be displayed on the marching left	47				
of the United States flag.	48				
(C) The state flag shall be displayed on the grounds of the	49				
state house when any executive or legislative branch of the state	50				

government is in session. Except as otherwise provided in this

division, no flag shall be displayed at the state house unless it	52				
directly represents the United States government, the military of					
the United States, the government of this state or of another	54				
state, or local governments in this state. Upon request, flags	55				
representing other countries may be displayed at the state house	56				
with the express approval of the capitol square review and					
advisory board.	58				
(D) The state flag shall be washed or dry cleaned when soiled	59				
and may be repaired. When the state flag is damaged beyond repair,					
it shall be destroyed privately either by cutting it into small					
pieces and burning it until only ashes remain or by sealing it in					
a plastic bag or box before discarding it in a trash collection.	63

Sec. 5.013. "I salute the flag of the state of Ohio and	65				
pledge to the buckeye state respect and loyalty" is hereby adopted	66				
as the official pledge to the state flag. The pledge shall not	67				
replace, preempt, or be recited before the pledge of allegiance to					
the United States flag.	69				
Section 2. That existing section 5.01 of the Revised Code is	70				
hereby repealed.
