A BILL

To amend section 5.01 and to enact sections 5.012 and 5.013 of the Revised Code to establish requirements governing the display and disposal of the state flag, to explain the symbolism of the state flag, and to adopt an official pledge to the state flag.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1.	That sect	ion 5.01 be	amended and s	sections 5.012	7
and 5.013 of th	e Revised	Code be enac	cted to read a	as follows:	8

9 Sec. 5.01. The flag of the state shall be pennant shaped burgee-shaped. It shall have three red and two white horizontal 10 stripes that represent the roads and waterways of the state. The 11 union of the flag shall be seventeen five-pointed stars, white in 12 a blue triangular field that represents the state's hills and 13 valleys, the base of which shall be the staff end or vertical edge 14 of the flag, and the apex of which shall be the center of the 15 middle red stripe. The stars shall be grouped around a red disc 16 superimposed upon a white circular "O." The thirteen stars grouped 17 around the "O" represent the original states of the United States 18 and the four stars added to the peak of the triangle symbolize 19

that Ohio was the seventeenth state admitted to the union. The "O"20represents the "O" in "Ohio" and suggests the state's nickname,21the buckeye state.The proportional dimensions of the flag and of22its various parts shall be according to the official design on23file in the office of the secretary of state. One state flag of24uniform dimensions shall be furnished to each company of the25organized militia.26

Sec. 5.012. (A) Display of the state flag at all state 27 buildings and public institutions, such as public school buildings 28 and state parks, is encouraged. If the state flag is displayed, it 29 may be flown every day when weather permits and shall be flown 30 from sunrise until sunset on all national and state holidays and 31 on any other days that the governor proclaims. The state flag may 32 be flown at night when properly lighted. When the state flag is 33 displayed outdoors, it shall be flown either from a flagpole or a 34 staff. Any staff from which the state flag is flown shall be at 35 least two and one-half times as long as the state flag. 36

(B) When the state flag and the United States flag are 37 displayed at the same time, the state flag shall not be larger 38 than the United States flag. When the state flag and the United 39 States flag are displayed together against a wall from crossed 40 staffs, the state flag shall be on the left of the United States 41 flag, and the staff supporting the state flag shall be behind the 42 staff supporting the United States flag. When the state flag is 43 flown from the same halyard as the United States flag, the state 44 flag shall be displayed beneath the United States flag. When the 45 state flag is carried in a procession in which the United States 46 flag is unfurled, the state flag shall be displayed on the 47 marching left of the United States flag. 48

(C) The state flag shall be washed or dry cleaned when soiled 49 and may be repaired. When the state flag is damaged beyond repair, 50

it shall be destroyed privately either by cutting it into small pieces and burning it until only ashes remain or by sealing it in a plastic bag or box before discarding it in a trash collection.	51 52 53 54
