BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 2744.01 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2744.01. As used in this chapter:

- (A) "Emergency call" means a call to duty, including, but not limited to, communications from citizens, police dispatches, and personal observations by peace officers of inherently dangerous situations that demand an immediate response on the part of a peace officer.
- (B) "Employee" means an officer, agent, employee, or servant, whether or not compensated or full-time or part-time, who is authorized to act and is acting within the scope of the officer's, agent's, employee's, or servant's employment for a political subdivision. "Employee" does not include an independent contractor and does not include any individual engaged by a school district

includes any elected or appointed official of a political	22
subdivision. "Employee" also includes a person who has been	23
convicted of or pleaded guilty to a criminal offense and who has	24
been sentenced to perform community service work in a political	25
subdivision whether pursuant to section 2951.02 of the Revised	26
Code or otherwise, and a child who is found to be a delinquent	27
child and who is ordered by a juvenile court pursuant to section	28
2151.355 of the Revised Code to perform community service or	29
community work in a political subdivision.	30
(C)(1) "Governmental function" means a function of a	31
political subdivision that is specified in division (C)(2) of this	32
section or that satisfies any of the following:	33
(a) A function that is imposed upon the state as an	34
obligation of sovereignty and that is performed by a political	35
subdivision voluntarily or pursuant to legislative requirement;	36

- (b) A function that is for the common good of all citizens of the state;
- (c) A function that promotes or preserves the public peace, health, safety, or welfare; that involves activities that are not engaged in or not customarily engaged in by nongovernmental persons; and that is not specified in division (G)(2) of this section as a proprietary function.
- (2) A "governmental function" includes, but is not limited 44 to, the following: 45
- (a) The provision or nonprovision of police, fire, emergency 46 medical, ambulance, and rescue services or protection; 47
- (b) The power to preserve the peace; to prevent and suppress riots, disturbances, and disorderly assemblages; to prevent, mitigate, and clean up releases of oil and hazardous and extremely hazardous substances as defined in section 3750.01 of the Revised

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Code; and to protect persons and property;	52
(c) The provision of a system of public education;	53
(d) The provision of a free public library system;	54
(e) The regulation of the use of, and the maintenance and	55
repair of, roads, highways, streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks,	56
bridges, aqueducts, viaducts, and public grounds;	57
(f) Judicial, quasi-judicial, prosecutorial, legislative, and	58
quasi-legislative functions;	59
(g) The construction, reconstruction, repair, renovation,	60
maintenance, and operation of buildings that are used in	61
connection with the performance of a governmental function,	62
including, but not limited to, office buildings and courthouses;	63
(h) The design, construction, reconstruction, renovation,	64
repair, maintenance, and operation of jails, places of juvenile	65
detention, workhouses, or any other detention facility, as defined	66
in section 2921.01 of the Revised Code;	
(i) The enforcement or nonperformance of any law;	68
(j) The regulation of traffic, and the erection or	69
nonerection of traffic signs, signals, or control devices;	70
(k) The collection and disposal of solid wastes, as defined	71
in section 3734.01 of the Revised Code, including, but not limited	72
to, the operation of solid waste disposal facilities, as	73
"facilities" is defined in that section, and the collection and	74
management of hazardous waste generated by households. As used in	75
division $(C)(2)(k)$ of this section, "hazardous waste generated by	76
households" means solid waste originally generated by individual	77
households that is listed specifically as hazardous waste in or	78
exhibits one or more characteristics of hazardous waste as defined	79
by rules adopted under section 3734.12 of the Revised Code, but	80
that is excluded from regulation as a hazardous waste by those	81

construction, or reconstruction of a public improvement,	84
including, but not limited to, a sewer system;	85
(m) The operation of a human job and family services	86
department or agency, including, but not limited to, the provision	87
of assistance to aged and infirm persons and to persons who are	88
<pre>indigent;</pre>	89
(n) The operation of a health board, department, or agency,	90
including, but not limited to, any statutorily required or	91
permissive program for the provision of immunizations or other	92
inoculations to all or some members of the public, provided that a	93
"governmental function" does not include the supply, manufacture,	94
distribution, or development of any drug or vaccine employed in	95
any such immunization or inoculation program by any supplier,	96
manufacturer, distributor, or developer of the drug or vaccine;	97
(o) The operation of mental health facilities, mental	98
retardation or developmental disabilities facilities, alcohol	99
treatment and control centers, and children's homes or agencies;	100
(p) The provision or nonprovision of inspection services of	101
all types, including, but not limited to, inspections in	102
connection with building, zoning, sanitation, fire, plumbing, and	103
electrical codes, and the taking of actions in connection with	104
those types of codes, including, but not limited to, the approval	105
of plans for the construction of buildings or structures and the	106
issuance or revocation of building permits or stop work orders in	107
connection with buildings or structures;	108
(q) Urban renewal projects and the elimination of slum	109
conditions;	110
(r) Flood control measures;	111

(s) The design, construction, reconstruction, renovation,	112
operation, care, repair, and maintenance of a township cemetery;	113
(t) The issuance of revenue obligations under section 140.06	114
of the Revised Code;	115
(u) The design, construction, reconstruction, renovation,	116
repair, maintenance, use, and operation of any recreational area	117
or facility, including, but not limited to, a park, playground,	118
playfield, indoor recreational facility, zoo, zoological park,	119
bath, swimming pool, pond, water park, wading pool, wave pool,	120
water slide, and other type of aquatic facility, or golf course,	121
bicycle motorcross facility, or other type of recreational area or	122
facility where bicycling, skating, skate boarding, or scooter	123
riding is engaged in;	124
(v) The provision of public defender services by a county or	125
joint county public defender's office pursuant to Chapter 120. of	126
the Revised Code;	
(w) A function that the general assembly mandates a political	128
subdivision to perform.	129
(D) "Law" means any provision of the constitution, statutes,	130
or rules of the United States or of this state; provisions of	131
charters, ordinances, resolutions, and rules of political	132
subdivisions; and written policies adopted by boards of education.	133
When used in connection with the "common law," this definition	134
does not apply.	135
(E) "Motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in section	136
4511.01 of the Revised Code.	137
(F) "Political subdivision" or "subdivision" means a	138
municipal corporation, township, county, school district, or other	139
body corporate and politic responsible for governmental activities	140
in a geographic area smaller than that of the state. "Political	141

(G)(1) "Proprietary function" means a function of a political subdivision that is specified in division (G)(2) of this section or that satisfies both of the following:

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- (a) The function is not one described in division (C)(1)(a) or (b) of this section and is not one specified in division (C)(2) of this section;
- (b) The function is one that promotes or preserves the public peace, health, safety, or welfare and that involves activities that are customarily engaged in by nongovernmental persons.
- (2) A "proprietary function" includes, but is not limited to, the following:

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(a) The operation of a hospital by one or more political	175
subdivisions;	176
(b) The design, construction, reconstruction, renovation,	177
repair, maintenance, and operation of a public cemetery other than	
a township cemetery;	
(c) The establishment, maintenance, and operation of a	180
utility, including, but not limited to, a light, gas, power, or	181
heat plant, a railroad, a busline or other transit company, an	182
airport, and a municipal corporation water supply system;	183
(d) The maintenance, destruction, operation, and upkeep of a	184
sewer system;	185
(e) The operation and control of a public stadium,	186
auditorium, civic or social center, exhibition hall, arts and	
crafts center, band or orchestra, or off-street parking facility.	188
(H) "Public roads" means public roads, highways, streets,	189
avenues, alleys, and bridges within a political subdivision.	190
"Public roads" does not include berms, shoulders, rights-of-way,	191
or traffic control devices unless the traffic control devices are	192
mandated by the Ohio manual of uniform traffic control devices.	193
(I) "State" means the state of Ohio, including, but not	194
limited to, the general assembly, the supreme court, the offices	195
of all elected state officers, and all departments, boards,	196
offices, commissions, agencies, colleges and universities,	197
institutions, and other instrumentalities of the state of Ohio.	198
"State" does not include political subdivisions.	199
Section 2. That existing section 2744.01 of the Revised Code	200
is hereby repealed.	201
