A BILL

To amend sections 4733.12 and 4733.16 of the Revised

Code relative to a business entity obtaining a

certificate of authorization to provide

professional engineering or surveying services if a

combination of registered professional engineers,

surveyors, or architects own collectively more than

fifty per cent of the business entity providing

those services.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4733.12 and 4733.16 of the Revised 9

Code be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4733.12. fee, which	shall be established by the board at an amount adequate
to cover the	e costs of processing the application.

The examination fee for professional engineers, which shall accompany the "notice of intention" for each scheduled first stage and second stage examination, shall be established by the board at an amount adequate to cover the expense of procuring, administering, and grading the examination. The registration fee, which shall be paid after the applicant has passed both examinations, shall be established by the board at an amount adequate to cover the expense of issuing a certificate of registration.

The examination fee for professional surveyors, which shall accompany the "notice of intention" for each scheduled first stage and second stage examination, shall be established by the board at an amount adequate to cover the expense of procuring, administering, and grading the examination. The registration fee, which shall be paid after the applicant has passed both examinations, shall be established by the board at an amount adequate to cover the expense of issuing a certificate of registration.

(B) The board shall establish the fee for a certificate of authorization issued under division (F) of section 4733.16 of the Revised Code in an amount not to exceed fifty dollars and the fee for annual renewal of a certificate of authorization, not to exceed twenty-five dollars. The fee for a duplicate certificate of authorization is five dollars.

Sec. 4733.16. (A) A firm, partnership, association, limited liability company, or corporation may provide professional engineering or professional surveying services in this state as long as the services are provided only through natural persons

registered to provide those services in the state, subject to the exemptions in sections 4733.17 and 4733.18 of the Revised Code and subject otherwise to the requirements of this chapter.

- (B) No firm, partnership, association, limited liability company, or corporation, except a corporation that was granted a charter prior to August 7, 1943, to engage in providing professional engineering or professional surveying services in this state or that was otherwise lawfully providing engineering services in this state prior to November 15, 1982, shall engage in providing <u>professional</u> engineering or <u>professional</u> surveying services, hold itself out to the public as being engaged in providing <u>professional</u> engineering or <u>professional</u> surveying services, or use a name including one or more of the words "engineer," "engineering," or "surveyor," or "surveying" or any modification or derivation of those words, unless the firm, partnership, association, limited liability company, or corporation obtains a certificate of authorization from the state board of registration for professional engineers and surveyors and files all information required to be filed under this section with the state board of registration for professional engineers and surveyors and otherwise complies with all requirements of this chapter. A nonprofit membership corporation may use a name including one or more of the words "engineer," "engineering," "surveyor," or "surveying" or any modification or derivation of those words without complying with this section.
- (C) A corporation may be organized under Chapter 1701. of the Revised Code, a professional association may be organized under Chapter 1785. of the Revised Code, or a limited liability company may be formed under Chapter 1705. of the Revised Code for the purpose of providing professional engineering, professional surveying, architectural, or landscape architectural services or any combination of those services. A corporation organized under

Chapter 1701. of the Revised Code for the purpose of providing those services also may be organized for any other purpose in accordance with that chapter.

- (D) No firm, partnership, association, limited liability company, or corporation shall provide or offer to provide professional engineering or professional surveying services in this state unless more than fifty per cent of the partners, members, or shareholders, more than fifty per cent of the directors in the case of a corporation or professional association, and more than fifty per cent of the managers in the case of a limited liability company the management of which is not reserved to its members, are professional engineers, professional surveyors, architects, or landscape architects, or a combination of those professions, who are registered in this state and who, own more than fifty per cent of the interests in the firm, partnership, association, limited liability company, or corporation; unless the requirements of this division and of section 1785.02 of the Revised Code are satisfied with respect to any professional association organized under Chapter 1785. of the Revised Code; or unless the requirements of this division and of Chapter 1705. of the Revised Code are satisfied with respect to a limited liability company formed under that chapter.
- (E) Each firm, partnership, association, limited liability company, or corporation through which professional engineering or professional surveying services are offered or provided in this state shall designate one or more partners, managers, members, officers, or directors as being in responsible charge of the professional engineering or professional surveying activities and decisions, and those designated persons shall be registered in this state. In the case of a corporation holding a certificate of authorization provided for in division (F) of this section, at least one of the persons so designated shall be a director of the

corporation. Each firm, partnership, association, limited	116
liability company, or corporation of that type shall annually file	117
with the state board of registration for professional engineers	118
and surveyors the name and address of each partner, manager,	119
officer, director, member, or shareholder, and each firm,	120
partnership, association, limited liability company, or	121
corporation of that type shall annually file with the board the	122
name and address of <u>each owner and</u> all persons designated as being	123
in responsible charge of the professional engineering or	124
professional surveying activities and decisions and any other	125
information the board may require. If there is a change in any	126
such person in the interval between filings, the change shall be	127
filed with the board in the manner and within the time that the	128
board determines.	129

(F) No corporation organized under Chapter 1701. of the 130 Revised Code shall engage in providing engineering or surveying 131 services in this state without obtaining a certificate of 132 authorization from the state board of registration for 133 professional engineers and surveyors. A corporation desiring a 134 certificate of authorization shall file with the board a copy of a 135 certificate of good standing from the secretary of state and a 136 listing on the form that the board directs of the names and 137 addresses of all officers, directors, and shareholders of the 138 corporation, the names and addresses of any individuals providing 139 professional services on behalf of the corporation who are 140 registered to practice professional engineering or professional 141 surveying in this state, and any other information the board 142 requires. If all requirements of this chapter are met, the board 143 may issue a certificate of authorization to the corporation. No 144 certificate of authorization shall be issued unless persons owning 145 more than fifty per cent of the corporation's shares and more than 146 fifty per cent of the interests in the corporation are 147 professional engineers, professional surveyors, architects, or 148

landscape architects, or a combination of those professions, who	149
are registered in this state. Any corporation that holds a	150
certificate of authorization under this section and that otherwise	151
meets the requirements of this chapter may be organized for any	152
purposes for which corporations may be organized under Chapter	153
1701. of the Revised Code and shall not be limited to the purposes	154
of providing professional engineering, surveying, architectural,	155
or landscape architectural services or any combination of those	156
services. The board, by rules adopted in accordance with Chapter	157
119. of the Revised Code, may require any firm, partnership,	158
association, or limited liability company not organized under	159
Chapter 1701. of the Revised Code that provides engineering or	160
surveying services to obtain a certificate of authorization. If	161
the board so requires, no firm, partnership, association, or	162
limited liability company shall engage in providing engineering or	163
surveying services without obtaining the certificate and complying	164
with the rules.	165

(G) This section does not modify any law applicable to the relationship between a person furnishing a professional service 167 and a person receiving that service, including liability arising 168 out of that service.

(H)(G) Nothing in this section shall restrict or limit in any 170 manner the authority or duty of the state board of registration 171 for professional engineers and surveyors with respect to natural 172 persons providing professional services or any law or rule 173 pertaining to standards of professional conduct. 174

(I)(H) Corporations, partnerships, associations, limited 175 liability companies, or firms organized under the laws of another 176 state or country wishing to provide professional engineering or 177 professional surveying services shall obtain a certificate of 178 authorization and meet the applicable requirements of this 179 section.
