Section 1. That section 2501.011 of the Revised Code be	4

fifth district court of appeals shall be elected at the general20election in 2000 for a term of six years beginning February 11,212001. The two additional judges whose terms begin on February 1022shall thereafter be elected to hold terms of six years.23

In the fifth district, any three judges shall comprise the court of appeals in the hearing and disposition of cases in accordance with any local rules of practice and procedure that may be adopted by the judges of the court.

(B) There shall be two additional judges of the court of

appeals of the sixth district, composed of Erie, Fulton, Huron,

Lucas, Ottawa, Sandusky, Williams, and Wood counties.

One of the additional judges of the sixth district court of 31 appeals shall be elected at the general election in 1980 for a 32 term of six years beginning February 10, 1981. One of the 33 additional judges of the sixth district court of appeals shall be 34 elected at the general election in 1990 for a term of six years 35 beginning on February 10, 1991. The additional judges shall 36 thereafter be elected to hold terms of six years. 37

In the sixth district, any three judges shall comprise the 38 court of appeals in the hearing and disposition of cases in 39 accordance with any $\frac{1}{2}$ local rules of practice and procedure that 40 may be adopted by the judges of the court. 41

(C) There shall be one additional judge of the court of

appeals of the seventh district, composed of Belmont, Carroll,

Columbiana, Harrison, Jefferson, Mahoning, Monroe, and Noble

counties.

The additional judge shall be elected at the general election 46 in 1996 for a term of six years beginning February 10, 1997. The 47 additional judge thereafter shall be elected to hold terms of six 48 years. 49

51 court of appeals in the hearing and disposition of cases in 52 accordance with any local rules of practice and procedure that may 53 be adopted by the judges of the court. (D) The judges provided for in this section and sections 54 2501.012 and 2501.013 of the Revised Code shall exercise the same 55 powers and jurisdiction and perform the same duties as the judges 56 of the courts of appeals; and shall receive the same compensation, 57 as provided by law, for the judges of the courts of appeals. 58 Section 2. That existing section 2501.011 of the Revised Code 59 is hereby repealed. 60
