Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, in any county 260 having two or more judges of the court of common pleas, in which 261 more than one-third of the judges plus one were previously elected 262 at the same election, if the office of one of those judges so 263 elected becomes vacant more than forty days prior to the second 264 general election preceding the expiration of that judge's term, 265 the office that that judge had filled shall be abolished as of the 266 date of the next general election, and a new office of judge of 267

the court of common pleas shall be created. The judge who is to	268
fill that new office shall be elected for a six-year term at the	269
next general election, and the term of that judge shall commence	270
on the first day of the year following that general election, on	271
which day no other judge's term begins, so that the number of	272
judges that the county shall elect shall not be reduced.	273
Judges of the probate division of the court of common pleas	274
are judges of the court of common pleas but shall be elected	275
pursuant to sections 2101.02 and 2101.021 of the Revised Code,	276
except in Adams, Harrison, Henry, Morgan, Morrow, Noble, and	277
Wyandot counties in which the judge of the court of common pleas	278
elected pursuant to this section also shall serve as judge of the	279
probate division.	280
Section 2. That existing section 2301.02 of the Revised Code	281
is hereby repealed.	282
