BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4755.40 and 4755.48 be amended and	10
section 4755.481 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	11
follows:	
Sec. 4755.40. As used in sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 and	13
4755 00 of the Pavised Code:	1.4

- (A) "Physical therapy" means the evaluation and treatment of 15 a person by physical measures and the use of therapeutic exercises 16 and rehabilitative procedures, with or without assistive devices, 17 for the purpose of preventing, correcting, or alleviating any 18 disability. If performed by a person who is adequately trained, 19 physical therapy includes the design, fabrication, revision, 20 education, and instruction in the use of various assistive devices 21 including braces, splints, ambulatory or locomotion devices, 22 wheelchairs, prosthetics, and orthotics. Physical therapy includes 23 the administration of topical drugs that have been prescribed by a 24 licensed health professional authorized to prescribe drugs, as 25 defined in section 4729.01 of the Revised Code. Physical therapy 26 also includes the establishment and modification of physical 27 therapy programs, treatment planning, instruction, and 28 consultative services. Physical measures include massage, heat, 29 cold, air, light, water, electricity, sound, and the performance 30 of tests of neuromuscular function as an aid to such treatment. 31 Physical therapy does not include the medical diagnosis of a 32 patient's disability, the use of Roentgen rays or radium for 33 diagnostic or therapeutic purposes, or the use of electricity for 34 cauterization or other surgical purposes. Physical therapy 35 includes physiotherapy. 36
- (B) "Physical therapist" means a person who practices or teaches physical therapy and includes physiotherapist. 38
- (C) "Physical therapist assistant" means a person who assists
 in the provision of physical therapy treatments under the
 supervision of a physical therapist, or teaches physical therapy
 under the supervision of a physical therapist, and includes
 physical therapy assistant.

- (D) "Supervision" means the availability and responsibility 44 of the supervisor for direction of the actions of the person 45 supervised.

	Sec. 4755.48.	(A) No person shall employ fraud or deception	
in	applying for or	securing a license to practice physical therapy	
or	to be a physical	therapist assistant.	

- (B) No person shall practice or in any way claim to the 50 public to be able to practice physical therapy, including practice 51 as a physical therapist assistant, unless the person holds a valid 52 license under sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised Code or 53 except as provided in section 4755.53 4755.56 of the Revised Code. 54
- (C) No person shall use the words or letters, physical therapist, physical therapy, physiotherapist, licensed physical therapist, P.T., Ph.T., P.T.T., R.P.T., L.P.T., M.P.T., D.P.T., M.S.P.T., P.T.A., physical therapy assistant, physical therapist assistant, physical therapy technician, licensed physical therapist assistant, L.P.T.A., R.P.T.A., or any other letters, words, abbreviations, or insignia, indicating or implying that the person is a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant without a valid license under sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised Code.
- (D) No person who practices physical therapy or assists in the provision of physical therapy treatments under the supervision of a physical therapist shall fail to display the person's current license granted under sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised Code in a conspicuous location in the place where the person spends the major part of the person's time so engaged.
- (E) Nothing in sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised 71

 Code shall affect or interfere with the performance of the duties 72

 of any physical therapist or physical therapist assistant in 73

 active service in the army, navy, coast guard, marine corps, air 74

 force, public health service, or marine hospital service of the 75

 United States, while so serving. 76

(F) No person shall practice physical therapy other than on	77
the prescription of, or the referral of a patient by, a person who	78
is licensed in this or another state to practice medicine and	79
surgery, chiropractic, dentistry, osteopathic medicine and	80
surgery, or podiatry podiatric medicine and surgery, or to	81
practice nursing as a certified registered nurse anesthetist,	82
clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified	83
nurse practitioner, within the scope of such practices, and whose	84
license is in good standing, unless either of the following	85
conditions is met:	86
(1) The person holds a master's or doctorate degree from a	87
professional physical therapy program that is accredited by a	88
national accreditation agency recognized by the United States	89
department of education and by the Ohio occupational therapy,	90

(G) In the prosecution of any person for violation of	95
