BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4/55.40 and 4/55.48 be amended and	ΤU	
section 4755.481 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	11

Sec. 4755.40. As used in sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 and	13	
4755.99 of the Revised Code:		
(A) "Physical therapy" means the evaluation and treatment of	15	
a person by physical measures and the use of therapeutic exercises	16	
and rehabilitative procedures, with or without assistive devices,	17	
for the purpose of preventing, correcting, or alleviating any	18	

disability. If performed by a person who is adequately trained,	19
physical therapy includes the design, fabrication, revision,	20
education, and instruction in the use of various assistive devices	21
including braces, splints, ambulatory or locomotion devices,	22
wheelchairs, prosthetics, and orthotics. Physical therapy includes	23
the administration of topical drugs that have been prescribed by a	24
licensed health professional authorized to prescribe drugs, as	25
defined in section 4729.01 of the Revised Code. Physical therapy	26
also includes the establishment and modification of physical	27
therapy programs, treatment planning, instruction, and	28
consultative services. Physical measures include massage, heat,	29
cold, air, light, water, electricity, sound, and the performance	30
of tests of neuromuscular function as an aid to such treatment.	31
Physical therapy does not include the medical diagnosis of a	32
patient's disability, the use of Roentgen rays or radium for	33
diagnostic or therapeutic purposes, or the use of electricity for	34
cauterization or other surgical purposes. Physical therapy	35
includes physiotherapy.	36

- (B) "Physical therapist" means a person who practices orteaches physical therapy and includes physiotherapist.
- (C) "Physical therapist assistant" means a person who assists
 in the provision of physical therapy treatments under the
 supervision of a physical therapist, or teaches physical therapy
 under the supervision of a physical therapist, and includes
 physical therapy assistant.

- (D) "Supervision" means the availability and responsibility 44 of the supervisor for direction of the actions of the person 45 supervised.
- sec. 4755.48. (A) No person shall employ fraud or deception
 in applying for or securing a license to practice physical therapy
 or to be a physical therapist assistant.

- (B) No person shall practice or in any way claim to the public to be able to practice physical therapy, including practice as a physical therapist assistant, unless the person holds a valid license under sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised Code or except as provided in section 4755.53 4755.56 of the Revised Code.
- (C) No person shall use the words or letters, physical 55 therapist, physical therapy, physiotherapist, licensed physical 56 therapist, P.T., Ph.T., P.T.T., R.P.T., L.P.T., M.P.T., D.P.T., 57 M.S.P.T., P.T.A., physical therapy assistant, physical therapist 58 assistant, physical therapy technician, licensed physical 59 therapist assistant, L.P.T.A., R.P.T.A., or any other letters, 60 words, abbreviations, or insignia, indicating or implying that the 61 person is a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant 62 without a valid license under sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the 63 Revised Code. 64
- (D) No person who practices physical therapy or assists in 65 the provision of physical therapy treatments under the supervision 66 of a physical therapist shall fail to display the person's current 67 license granted under sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised 68 Code in a conspicuous location in the place where the person 69 spends the major part of the person's time so engaged. 70
- (E) Nothing in sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised 71

 Code shall affect or interfere with the performance of the duties 72

 of any physical therapist or physical therapist assistant in 73

 active service in the army, navy, coast guard, marine corps, air 74

 force, public health service, or marine hospital service of the 75

 United States, while so serving. 76
- (F) No person shall practice physical therapy other than on 77 the prescription of, or the referral of a patient by, a person who 78 is licensed in this or another state to practice medicine and 79 surgery, chiropractic, dentistry, osteopathic medicine and 80

(2) If the physical therapist determines, based on reasonable	114	
evidence, that no substantial progress has been made with respect	115

(4) If, at any time, the physical therapist has reason to	147
believe that the patient has symptoms or conditions that require	148
treatment or services beyond the scope of practice of a physical	149
therapist, the physical therapist shall refer the patient to a	150
licensed health care practitioner acting within the practitioner's	151
scope of practice.	152
(B) Nothing in sections 4755.40 to 4755.56 of the Revised	153
Code shall be construed to require reimbursement under any health	154
insuring corporation policy, contract, or agreement, any sickness	155
and accident insurance policy, the medical assistance program as	156
defined in section 5111.01 of the Revised Code, or the health	157
partnership program or qualified health plans established pursuant	158
