BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 2935.09 of the Revised Code be	9
amended to read as follows:	10
Sec. 2935.09. (A) As used in this section, "reviewing	11
official" means a judge of a court of record, the prosecuting	12
attorney or attorney charged by law with the prosecution of	13
offenses in a court or before a magistrate, or a magistrate.	14
(B) In all cases not provided by sections 2935.02 to 2935.08-	15
inclusive, of the Revised Code, in order to cause the arrest or	16
prosecution of a person charged with committing an offense in this	17
state, a peace officer, or a private citizen having knowledge of	18

the facts, shall comply with this section.	19
(C) A peace officer who seeks to cause an arrest or	20
prosecution under this section may file with the judge or clerk of	21
a court of record, or with a magistrate, a reviewing official or	22
the clerk of a court of record an affidavit charging the offense	23
committed, or shall.	24
(D) A private citizen having knowledge of the facts who seeks	25
to cause an arrest or prosecution under this section may file such	26
an affidavit charging the offense committed with the prosecuting	27
attorney or attorney charged by law with the prosecution of	28
offenses in court or before such magistrate, a reviewing official	29
for the purpose of having review to determine if a complaint	30
should be filed by such the prosecuting or other authorized	31
attorney or attorney charged by law with the prosecution of	32
