Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, in any county 273 having two or more judges of the court of common pleas, in which 274 more than one-third of the judges plus one were previously elected 275 at the same election, if the office of one of those judges so 276 elected becomes vacant more than forty days prior to the second 277 general election preceding the expiration of that judge's term, 278 the office that that judge had filled shall be abolished as of the 279 date of the next general election, and a new office of judge of 280 the court of common pleas shall be created. The judge who is to 281 fill that new office shall be elected for a six-year term at the 282 next general election, and the term of that judge shall commence 283 on the first day of the year following that general election, on 284 which day no other judge's term begins, so that the number of 285 judges that the county shall elect shall not be reduced. 286

Judges of the probate division of the court of common pleas 287 are judges of the court of common pleas but shall be elected 288 pursuant to sections 2101.02 and 2101.021 of the Revised Code, 289 except in Adams, Harrison, Henry, Morgan, Morrow, Noble, and 290 Wyandot counties in which the judge of the court of common pleas 291 elected pursuant to this section also shall serve as judge of the 292 probate division.

Section 2. That existing section 2301.02 of the Revised Code 294 is hereby repealed.
