То	amend sections 4169.01, 4169.03, 4169.08, and	1
	4169.09 of the Revised Code to modify duties and	2
	liabilities of ski area operators and skiers,	3
	including duties and liabilities relating to the	4
	use of freestyle terrain and tubing parks in ski	5
	areas.	6

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4169.01, 4169.03, 4169.08, and

4169.09 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 4169.01. As used in this chapter:	9
(A) "Skier" means any person who is using <del>or wearing skis or</del>	10
any other device or any person who for the purpose of skiing is on	11
a ski slope or ski trail that is located at the facilities of a	12
ski area, including, but not limited to, the ski slopes and ski	13
trails, for the purpose of skiing, which includes, without	14
limitation, sliding or jumping on snow or ice on skis, a	15
snowboard, sled, tube, snowbike, toboggan, or any other device.	16
(B) "Passenger" means any person who is being transported or	17
conveyed by a passenger tramway.	18

(C) "Ski slopes" or "ski trails" means those sites that are	19
reserved or maintained and are open for use, as designated by a	20
ski area operator.	21
(D) "Ski area" means all the ski slopes, ski trails, and	22
passenger tramways that are administered or operated as a single	
enterprise within this state.	24
(E) "Ski area operator" means a person or organization that	25
is responsible for the operation of a ski area, including an	26
agency of this state or of a political subdivision thereof.	27
(F) "Passenger tramway" means a device used to transport	28
passengers uphill, whether on skis or other devices or without	29
skis or other devices, or in cars on tracks or suspended in the	30
air, by the use of steel cables, chains, or belts or by ropes, and	31
that is usually supported by trestles or towers with one or more	32
spans. "Passenger tramway" includes <u>all of the following</u> :	33
(1) Aerial passenger tramway, a device used to transport	34
passengers in several open or enclosed cars attached to and	35
suspended from a moving wire rope or attached to a moving wire	36
rope and supported on a standing wire rope, or similar devices;	37
(2) Skimobile, a device in which a passenger car running on	38
steel or wooden tracks is attached to and pulled by a steel cable,	39
or similar devices;	40
(3) Chair lift, a device on which passengers are carried on	41
chairs suspended in the air and attached to a moving cable, chain,	42
or link belt supported by trestles or towers with one or more	43
spans, or similar devices. Chair lifts need not include foot-rests	44
or passenger restraint devices.	45
(4) J bar, T bar, or platter pull, devices that pull skiers	46

riding on skis or other devices by means of an attachment to a

main overhead cable supported by trestles or towers with one or

skiing as a recreational sport is hazardous to skiers regardless	109
of all feasible safety measures that can be taken. It further	110
recognizes that a skier expressly assumes the risk of and legal	111
responsibility for any losses or damages injury, death, or loss to	112
person or property that results from the inherent risks of	113
skiing, which include, but are not limited to, <del>losses or damages</del>	114
injury, death, or loss to person or property caused by variations	115
in terrain changing weather conditions; surface or subsurface snow	116
or ice conditions; hard pack, powder, packed powder, wind pack,	117
corn, crust, slush, cut-up snow, and machine-made snow; bare	118
spots, rocks, trees, stumps, and other forms of forest growth or	119

terrain, which injury, death, or loss to person or property is	135
caused by course, venue, or area conditions that visual inspection	136
should have revealed or by collision with a spectator, competition	137
official, ski area personnel, or another competitor or freestyler.	138

(3) Provided the ski area operator complies with division	139
(B)(5) of this section, no liability shall attach to a ski area	140
operator for injury, death, or loss to person or property suffered	141
by any skier using a tubing park, which injury, death, or loss to	142
person or property is caused by course design or maintenance or	143
conditions that visual inspection should have revealed or by	144
collision with another skier.	145
(B) Therefore, the The legal responsibilities of a ski area	146
operator to a skier with respect to any injury or, death, or loss	147
to person or property resulting in any way from an inherent risk	148
of the sport shall not be those of the common law duty of premises	149
owners to business invitees. A ski area operator shall have,	150
however, the following responsibilities:	151
(1) To mark all trail maintenance vehicles and to furnish	152
such vehicles with flashing or rotating lights that shall be in	153
operation whenever the vehicles are working or are moving in the	
ski area;	155
(2) To mark with a visible sign or other warning implement	156
the location of any hydrant or similar equipment that is used in	157
snowmaking operations and located anywhere in the ski area;	158
(3) To mark, at the base of a slope or hill where skiers	159
embark on a passenger tramway serving the slope or hill or at the	160
top of a trail or slope, such slopes, trails, and hills with signs	161
indicating their relative degree of difficulty. The signs must be	162
the type that have been approved by the national ski areas	163
association and are in current use by the industry:	164
(4) Prior to the use of any portion of a freestyle terrain	165
area made available by the ski area operator, to allow each	166
freestyler or competitor a reasonable opportunity to visually	167
inspect the course, venue, or area of the freestyle terrain;	168

(5) To allow skiers using a tubing park visible access to the
