BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:	
Section 1. That sections 4169.01, 4169.03, 4169.08, and	7
4169.09 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 4169.01. As used in this chapter:	9
(A) "Skier" means any person who is using or wearing skis or	10
any other device or any person who for the purpose of skiing is on	11
a ski slope or ski trail that is located at the facilities of a	12
ski area, including, but not limited to, the ski slopes and ski	13
trails, for the purpose of skiing, which includes, without	14
limitation, sliding or jumping on snow or ice on skis, a	15
snowboard, sled, tube, snowbike, toboggan or any other device.	16
(B) "Passenger" means any person who is being transported or	17

- (C) "Ski slopes" or "ski trails" means those sites that are reserved or maintained and are open for use, as designated by a 20 ski area operator.

 (D) "Ski area" means all the ski slopes, ski trails, and 22 passenger tramways that are administered or operated as a single 23
- (E) "Ski area operator" means a person or organization that 25 is responsible for the operation of a ski area, including an 26 agency of this state or of a political subdivision thereof. 27
- (F) "Passenger tramway" means a device used to transport 28 passengers uphill, whether on skis or other devices or without 29 skis or other devices, or in cars on tracks or suspended in the 30 air, by the use of steel cables, chains, or belts or by ropes, and 31 that is usually supported by trestles or towers with one or more 32 spans. "Passenger tramway" includes all of the following: 33
- (1) Aerial passenger tramway, a device used to transport

 passengers in several open or enclosed cars attached to and

 suspended from a moving wire rope or attached to a moving wire

 rope and supported on a standing wire rope, or similar devices;

- (2) Skimobile, a device in which a passenger car running onsteel or wooden tracks is attached to and pulled by a steel cable,or similar devices;
- (3) Chair lift, a device on which passengers are carried on

 thairs suspended in the air and attached to a moving cable, chain,

 or link belt supported by trestles or towers with one or more

 spans, or similar devices. Chair lifts need not include foot-rests

- (4) J bar, T bar, or platter pull, devices that pull skiers 46 riding on skis or other devices by means of an attachment to a 47 main overhead cable supported by trestles or towers with one or 48
