Notwithstanding sections 3333.61 to 3333.70 of the Revised 314 Code, a nonpublic four-year Ohio institution of higher education 315 may submit a proposal for the Ohio Research Scholars Program to 316 recruit scientists to the faculty of the nonpublic institution if 317 the proposal is to be implemented in collaboration with a state 318 university or college, as defined in section 3333.60 of the 319 Revised Code. If the Chancellor of the Board of Regents grants a 320 nonpublic institution an award under the Ohio Research Scholars 321 Program, the nonpublic institution shall comply with all 322 requirements of sections 3333.61 to 3333.70 of the Revised Code 323 and the rules adopted under section 3333.61 of the Revised Code 324 that apply to state universities or colleges awarded grants under 325 the Ohio Research Scholars Program. 326

Section 7. The sections of law contained in this act, and the 327 items of which they are composed, are not subject to referendum. 328 Therefore, under Ohio Constitution, Article II, Section 1d and 329 section 1.471 of the Revised Code, the sections and items of law 330 go into immediate effect when this act becomes law. 331
