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A B I L L

To enact section 4501.81 of the Revised Code to 1
establish a next of kin database within the Bureau 2
of Motor Vehicles. 3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.81 of the Revised Code be 4
enacted to read as follows: 5

Sec. 4501.81. (A) The bureau of motor vehicles shall 6
establish a database of the next of kin of persons who are issued 7
motor vehicle certificates of registration and driver's licenses, 8
commercial driver's licenses, temporary instruction permits, and 9
identification cards. Information in the database shall be 10
accessible only to employees of the bureau, deputy registrars, and 11
law enforcement officers employed by a law enforcement agency. 12

(B) When a person applies for a motor vehicle certificate of 14
registration, driver's license, commercial driver's license, 15
temporary instruction permit, or identification card, the 16
applicant shall be afforded the opportunity to list the name, 17
address, telephone number, and relationship to the applicant of at 18

least one contact person whom the applicant wishes to be contacted 19
by a law enforcement officer if the applicant is involved in a 20
motor vehicle accident or emergency situation and the applicant is 21
killed or is seriously injured or rendered unconscious and is 22
unable to communicate with the contact person. The contact person 23
may or may not be a next of kin of the applicant. 24

(C) The bureau, in accordance with Chapter 119. of the 26
Revised Code, shall adopt rules to implement this section. At a 27
minimum, the rules shall address all of the following: 28

(1) The methods whereby a person who has submitted the name 29
of a contact person for inclusion in the database may make changes 30
to that entry; 31

(2) Whether or not the entries in the database are to be 32
included at any location and in any form on driver's licenses, 33
commercial driver's licenses, temporary instruction permits, or 34
identification cards. If database entries are placed on these 35
items, the entries shall be in a form so that they can be read 36
only by employees of the bureau, deputy registrars, and law 37
enforcement officers employed by a law enforcement agency. 38

(3) Any other aspect of the database or its operation that 39
the registrar of motor vehicles determines is necessary in order 40
to implement this section. 41

(D) In the event of a motor vehicle accident or emergency 42
situation in which a person is killed or is seriously injured or 43
rendered unconscious and is unable to communicate with the contact 44
person specified in the database, a law enforcement officer shall 45
make a good faith effort to notify the contact person of the 46
situation, but neither the law enforcement officer nor the law 47
enforcement agency that employs that law enforcement officer 48
incurs any liability if the law enforcement officer is not able to 49

make contact with the contact person. 50

Section 2. The Bureau of Motor Vehicles shall adopt rules 51
establishing the next of kin database described in Section 1 of 52
this act, and the database shall be operational, not later than 53
ninety days after the effective date of this section. 54

Section 3. This act shall be known as the "Money-Burge Act." 55
