(B)(3) If a township has a population of fifteen thousand or more in the unincorporated territory of the township, the board of township trustees, after at least one public hearing, may do either of the following:

(1)(a) By a unanimous vote, adopt a resolution establishing a 57 limited home rule government under which the township exercises 58 limited powers of local self-government and limited police powers 59 as authorized by this chapter. The resolution shall become 60 effective thirty days after the date of its adoption unless within 61 that thirty-day period there is presented to the board of township 62 trustees a petition, signed by a number of registered electors 63 residing in the unincorporated area of the township equal to at 64 least ten per cent of the total vote cast for all candidates for 65 governor in that area at the most recent general election at which 66 a governor was elected, requesting the board of township trustees 67 to submit the question of establishing a limited home rule 68 government to the electors of that area for approval or rejection 69 at a special election to be held on the day of the next primary or 70 general election occurring at least seventy-five days after the 71 petition is presented. Each part of the petition shall meet the 72 requirements specified in section 3501.38 of the Revised Code. 73 Upon timely receipt of the petition, the board of township 74 trustees shall adopt a resolution causing the board of elections 75 to submit to the electors of the unincorporated area of the 76 township the question of whether the township should adopt a 77 limited home rule government. 78
