SYNOPSIS

23 **School Districts - Fees for Instructional Materials for**
24 **Economically Disadvantaged Students**

25 **R.C. 3313.642**

26 Prohibits every school district from charging students
27 eligible for free lunch under federal law fees for materials
28 necessary to participate fully in a course of instruction. This
29 revises and expands the current law, which prohibits school
30 districts that receive a poverty-based assistance subsidy under
31 the current school funding system from charging instructional
32 fees to students whose families participate in Ohio Works First
33 or the Disability Assistance program. The bill maintains the
34 current law but specifies that it applies to districts that
35 received a poverty-based assistance payment in FY 2009. (The
36 evidence-based model for school funding does not include a
37 discrete subsidy like poverty-based assistance, but accounts for
38 low-income students in other ways.)
