23 School Districts - Fees for Instructional Materials for 24 Economically Disadvantaged Students

R.C. 3313.642

Prohibits every school district from charging students eligible for free lunch under federal law fees for materials necessary to participate fully in a course of instruction. This revises and expands the current law, which prohibits school districts that receive a poverty-based assistance subsidy under the current school funding system from charging instructional fees to students whose families participate in Ohio Works First or the Disability Assistance program. The bill maintains the current law but specifies that it applies to districts that received a poverty-based assistance payment in FY 2009. (The evidence-based model for school funding does not include a discrete subsidy like poverty-based assistance, but accounts for low-income students in other ways.)
