In the department of transportation, 538 there shall be an assistant director for business management, an 539 assistant director for field operations, and an assistant director 540 for transportation policy, each of whom shall be designated by the 541 director of transportation. A (B) An executive director may designate any of the 563 executive director's assistant executive directors or a deputy 564 executive director to serve in the executive director's place as a 565 member of any board, committee, authority, or commission of which 566 the executive director is, by law, a member. The designee, when 567 present, shall be counted in determining whether a quorum is 568 present at any meeting. The designee may vote and participate in 569 all proceedings and actions of the board, committee, authority, or 570 commission, provided that the designee shall not execute or cause 571 a facsimile of the designee's signature to be placed on any 572 obligation, or execute any trust agreement or indenture. The 573 designation shall be in writing, executed by the designating 574 executive director, filed with the secretary of the board, 575 committee, authority, or commission, and shall be in effect until 576 withdrawn or superseded by a new designation. 577

department, and distribute the work of the department among such 599
<u>the</u> divisions. Each officer created by section 121.04 of the 600
Revised Code shall be the head of such a division. 601

With the approval of the governor, the director of each602department may consolidate any two or more of the offices created603in the department by section 121.04 of the Revised Code, or reduce604the number of or create new divisions therein.605

The listed in sections 121.04 and 121.041 to 121.049 of the 606 Revised Code in accordance with those sections and any other 607 applicable provision of law. The executive director of each 608 department may prescribe rules for the government of the 609 department, the conduct of its employees, the performance of its 610 business, and the custody, use, and preservation of the records, 611 papers, books, documents, and property pertaining thereto to the 612 department. 613

Sec. 121.11. (A) Each officer whose executive director614position or whose office or division is created by sections615121.02, 121.04, 121.041 to 121.049, and 121.05 of the Revised616Code, before entering upon the officer's duties of office, shall617take and subscribe an oath of office as provided by law and give618bond, conditioned according to law, with security to be approved619by the governor in the penal sum, not less than ten thousand620

dollars, fixed by the governor. The department of administrative621services finance and operations may procure from any duly622authorized corporate surety a blanket bond covering the officers623described in those sections and any other officers the governor624designates. The bond and oath of the officers described in those625sections shall be filed in the office of the secretary of state.626

(B) The <u>executive</u> director of each department, with the
approval of the governor, may require any chief of a division, or
any officer or employee in the <u>executive</u> director's department, to
give bond in the amount the governor prescribes. The bond or bonds
may, in the discretion of the <u>executive</u> director, be individual,
schedule, or blanket bonds.

(C) The premium on any bond required or authorized by this633section may be paid from the state treasury.634

Sec. 121.13. The <u>executive</u> director of each department may, 635 with the approval of the governor, <u>may</u> establish and appoint 636 advisory boards to aid in the conduct of the work of <u>his the</u> 637 <u>executive director's</u> department or any division thereof of the 638 <u>department</u>. Such The advisory boards shall exercise no 639 administrative function, and their members shall receive no 640 compensation, but may receive their actual and necessary expenses. 641

sec. 121.15. The executive director of each department shall, 643 with the approval of the governor, shall maintain a central office 644 at a location in the state that the executive director finds 645 necessary for the efficient performance of the department. The 646 central office of a department shall not be relocated from 647 Columbus to another location in this state until the executive 648 director of the department has conducted a cost-benefit analysis 649 of the relocation and provided a copy of the analysis to the 650

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governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the 651 president of the senate and the relocation has been approved by an 652 act of the general assembly. 653

The executive director of each department may, with the 654 approval of the governor, <u>may</u> establish and maintain, at places 655 other than the location of the central office, branch offices for 656 the conduct of any one or more functions of the department. 657

No relocation of departments or employees of departments from 658 one location in this state to another shall be carried out that 659 will result in an increase in the total number of employees of all 660 departments or an increase in the total number of employees in any 661 department that is relocated. This section does not prevent a 662 department from increasing the number of its employees to meet the 663 demands of its workload or for any other reason arising from 664 circumstances unrelated to the department's relocation. 665

Sec. 121.17. Under the direction of the governor, the 666 executive directors of departments shall devise a practical and 667 working basis for co-operation cooperation and co-ordination 668 coordination of work and for the elimination of duplication and 669 overlapping functions. They shall co-operate <u>cooperate</u> with each 670 other in the employment of services and the use of quarters and 671 equipment. The executive director of any department may empower or 672 require an employee of another department, subject to the consent 673 of the superior officer of the employee, to perform any duty which 674 he that the executive director might require of his the director's 675 own subordinates. 676

Section 2. That existing sections 121.02, 121.03, 121.05, 677 121.06, 121.07, 121.11, 121.13, 121.15, and 121.17 of the Revised 678 Code are hereby repealed. 679

Section 3. That section 121.04 of the Revised Code is hereby 680

repealed.

Section 4. Sections 1, 2, and 3 of this act take effect on	682
January 1, 2011. Prior to that effective date, the General	683
Assembly shall enact legislation that amends, repeals, and enacts	684
the sections of the Revised Code that are necessary to implement	685
this act and to provide for orderly transfer of the duties and	686
functions of the several executive departments and public bodies	687
of state government to the departments that are created by the	688
amendment of this act to section 121.02 of the Revised Code and	689
whose responsibilities are delineated by the enactment by this act	690
of sections 121.04 and 121.041 to 121.049 of the Revised Code, as	691
enacted by this act.	692

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
