A BILL

To enact section 3707.37 of the Revised Code to	1
authorize the establishment of syringe exchange	2
programs.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3707.37 of the Revised Code be	4
enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3707.37. (A) As used in this section:	6
(1) "Bloodborne pathogens" means the human immunodeficiency	7
virus (HIV), hepatitis B virus, and hepatitis C virus.	8
(2) "Board of health" means the board of health of a city or	9
general health district or the authority having the duties of a	10
board of health under section 3709.05 of the Revised Code.	11
(3) "Controlled substance" has the same meaning as in section	12
3719.01 of the Revised Code.	13
(4) "Injection drug user" means a person who uses a syringe	14
or hypodermic needle to inject a controlled substance into the	15
person's own body.	16
(B) A board of health may establish a syringe exchange	17

program for the purpose of reducing the transmission of bloodborne	18
pathogens among the residents of the health district represented	19
by the board. The cost of the program is the responsibility of the	20
board of health.	21
(C) A syringe exchange program shall, at a minimum, do all of	22
the following with respect to the program's operation and its	23
<u>participants:</u>	24
(1) Provide a sterile syringe or hypodermic needle to each	25
injection drug user in exchange for each respective used syringe	26
or needle collected from the user;	27
(2) Dispose of used syringes and hypodermic needles in	28
accordance with Chapter 3734. of the Revised Code;	29
(3) Provide safety protocols and education regarding handling	30
and disposal of syringes and hypodermic needles to each injection	31
<u>drug user;</u>	32
(4) Provide each injection drug user with the information and	33
means to protect the user, any person sharing the user's syringes	34
or needles, and the user's family from exposure to bloodborne	35
pathogens;	36
(5) Provide counseling to each injection drug user regarding	37
exposure to bloodborne pathogens;	38
(6) Refer each injection drug user to the board of alcohol,	39
drug addiction, and mental health services that serves the area in	40
which the health district is located;	41
(7) Encourage each injection drug user to seek appropriate	42
medical, mental health, or social services;	43
(8) Use a recordkeeping system that ensures that the identity	44
of each injection drug user remains anonymous;	45
(9) Provide each injection drug user with a wallet	46
certificate that states that the user is an active participant in	47

48 the program. (D) If a board of health establishes a syringe exchange 49 program, the board shall establish policies and procedures for the 50 program. The policies and procedures shall be developed in 51 consultation with the interested parties identified in division 52 (E)(1) of this section and, at a minimum, shall address all of the 53 54 following: (1) Subject to the standards established in rules adopted 55 under division (I) of this section, the content of the wallet 56 certificate to be provided to each active participant in the 57 program, including the certificate's expiration date as determined 58 by the board, and the distribution of certificates to 59 participants; 60 (2) Notification of each relevant law enforcement agency 61 regarding the program, including the location of each facility to 62 be used by the program and the immunity from criminal liability 63 granted by division (G) of this section; 64 (3) Provision of care to program participants in need of 65 immediate medical attention at the time they receive syringes or 66 hypodermic needles through the program; 67 (4) Compliance with applicable state and federal rules and 68 regulations governing participant confidentiality. 69 (E)(1) Before establishing a syringe exchange program, the 70 board of health shall consult with all of the following interested 71 parties from the health district represented by the board: 72 73 (a) Law enforcement representatives; (b) Prosecutors, as defined in section 2935.01 of the Revised 74 Code; 75 (c) Representatives of alcohol and drug addiction programs 76

certified under section 3793.06 of the Revised Code;

(d) Persons recovering from substance abuse;	78
(e) Relevant private, nonprofit organizations, including	79
hepatitis C and HIV advocacy organizations;	80
(f) Residents of the health district;	81
(g) The board of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental health	82
services that serves the area in which the health district is	83
located;	84
(h) Any other interested parties selected by the board of	85
health.	86
(2) When consulting with the interested parties, the board of	87
health and the interested parties shall consider, at a minimum,	88
all of the following:	89
(a) The scope of transmission of bloodborne pathogens through	90
syringe or hypodermic needle use in the health district;	91
(b) The population to be served by the syringe exchange	92
program;	93
(c) Concerns of the law enforcement representatives;	94
(d) Day-to-day administration of the program, including the	95
hiring of employees or use of volunteers.	96
(F) A board of health may contract with a private, nonprofit	97
organization to operate a syringe exchange program on behalf of	98
the board. A contract may not be in effect longer than one year.	99
<u>Before a contract expires, the board shall review the</u>	100
contract to determine whether it should be renewed. During the	101
review, the board shall consult with interested parties selected	102
by the board and consider the issues listed under division (E)(2)	103
of this section. After the review, if the board determines that	104
the organization has satisfactorily carried out the purpose of the	105
program and will continue to do so, the board may renew the	106
contract.	107

(G) The following are not subject to criminal liability under	108
<u>sections 2923.24, 2925.12, 2925.14, and 3719.172 of the Revised</u>	109
<u>Code:</u>	110
(1) An employee or volunteer of a syringe exchange program	111
when carrying out the duties of the program;	112
(2) An injection drug user who is within one thousand feet of	113
a program facility and is in possession of a wallet certificate	114
stating that the user is an active participant in the program.	115
(H) A board of health that establishes a syringe exchange	116
program shall include details about the program in its annual	117
report prepared under section 3707.47 of the Revised Code.	118
(I) The department of alcohol and drug addiction services	119
shall adopt rules establishing statewide standards for the wallet	120
certificates to be issued to participants of syringe exchange	121
programs. The rules shall be adopted in accordance with Chapter	122
119. of the Revised Code.	123
