ABILL

To amend sections 4742.02, 4742.03, 4742.04, 4742.05, 1 and 4742.06, to amend, for the purpose of adopting new section numbers as shown in parentheses, 3 sections 4742.02 (4742.03), 4742.03 (4742.04), 4 4742.04 (4742.05), 4742.05 (4742.06), and 4742.06 5 (4742.07), and to enact new section 4742.02 of the 6 Revised Code to require certification of emergency 7 service telecommunicators and modify training 8 requirements. 9

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4742.02, 4742.03, 4742.04, 4742.05,	10
and 4742.06 be amended, that sections 4742.02 (4742.03), 4742.03	11

(4742.07) be amended for the purpose of adopting new section	13
numbers as shown in parentheses, and that new section 4742.02 of	14

effective date of this section November 5, 1997. In developing the	23
program, the state board and the emergency service providers shall	24
accept and consider suggestions from any political subdivision or	25
other entity, whether located within or outside of this state,	26

(6) A requirement that any employee of an emergency service	47

provider may enroll in and complete any course offered under the

program at no charge by the state board to the employee or	49

(7) A requirement that space available in each basic course	54
