A BILL

To amend sections 3503.19, 3505.181, 3505.182, and 1 3505.183 of the Revised Code to require a 2 provisional ballot to be remade and counted for 3 the offices, questions, and issues for which the 4 provisional voter was eligible to vote, if the 5 election official assisting that provisional voter 6 failed to direct the provisional voter to the correct precinct, and to revise the portion of the 8 provisional ballot affirmation required to be 9

Section 1. That sections 3503.19, 3505.181, 3505.182, and	11
3505.183 of the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	12
Sec. 3503.19. (A) Persons qualified to register or to change	13
their registration because of a change of address or change of	14
name may register or change their registration in person at any	15
state or local office of a designated agency, at the office of the	16

high school or vocational school, at a public library, at the 18 office of a county treasurer, or at a branch office established by 19 the board of elections, or in person, through another person, or 20 by mail at the office of the secretary of state or at the office 21 of a board of elections. A registered elector may also change the 22 elector's registration on election day at any polling place where 23 the elector is eligible to vote, in the manner provided under 24 section 3503.16 of the Revised Code. 25

Any state or local office of a designated agency, the office 26 of the registrar or any deputy registrar of motor vehicles, a 27 public high school or vocational school, a public library, or the 28 office of a county treasurer shall transmit any voter registration 29 application or change of registration form that it receives to the 30 board of elections of the county in which the state or local 31 office is located, within five days after receiving the voter 32 registration application or change of registration form. 33

An otherwise valid voter registration application that is 34 returned to the appropriate office other than by mail must be 35 received by a state or local office of a designated agency, the 36 office of the registrar or any deputy registrar of motor vehicles, 37 a public high school or vocational school, a public library, the 38 office of a county treasurer, the office of the secretary of 39 state, or the office of a board of elections no later than the 40 thirtieth day preceding a primary, special, or general election 41 for the person to qualify as an elector eligible to vote at that 42 election. An otherwise valid registration application received 43 after that day entitles the elector to vote at all subsequent 44 elections. 45

Any state or local office of a designated agency, the office 46 of the registrar or any deputy registrar of motor vehicles, a 47 public high school or vocational school, a public library, or the 48 office of a county treasurer shall date stamp a registration 49

application or change of name or change of address form it 50 receives using a date stamp that does not disclose the identity of 51 the state or local office that receives the registration. 52

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Voter registration applications, if otherwise valid, that are returned by mail to the office of the secretary of state or to the office of a board of elections must be postmarked no later than the thirtieth day preceding a primary, special, or general election in order for the person to qualify as an elector eligible to vote at that election. If an otherwise valid voter registration application that is returned by mail does not bear a postmark or a legible postmark, the registration shall be valid for that election if received by the office of the secretary of state or the office of a board of elections no later than twenty-five days preceding any special, primary, or general election.

- (B)(1) Any person may apply in person, by telephone, by mail, 64 or through another person for voter registration forms to the 65 office of the secretary of state or the office of a board of 66 elections. An individual who is eliqible to vote as a uniformed 67 services voter or an overseas voter in accordance with 42 U.S.C. 68 1973ff-6 also may apply for voter registration forms by electronic 69 means to the office of the secretary of state or to the board of 70 elections of the county in which the person's voting residence is 71 located pursuant to section 3503.191 of the Revised Code. 72
- (2)(a) An applicant may return the applicant's completed 73 registration form in person or by mail to any state or local 74 office of a designated agency, to a public high school or 75 vocational school, to a public library, to the office of a county 76 treasurer, to the office of the secretary of state, or to the 77 office of a board of elections. An applicant who is eligible to 78 vote as a uniformed services voter or an overseas voter in 79 accordance with 42 U.S.C. 1973ff-6 also may return the applicant's 80 completed voter registration form electronically to the office of 81

the secretary of state or to the board of elections of the county 82 in which the person's voting residence is located pursuant to 83 section 3503.191 of the Revised Code. 84

(b) Subject to division (B)(2)(c) of this section, an 85 applicant may return the applicant's completed registration form 86 through another person to any board of elections or the office of 87 the secretary of state. 88

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- (c) A person who receives compensation for registering a voter shall return any registration form entrusted to that person by an applicant to any board of elections or to the office of the secretary of state.
- (d) If a board of elections or the office of the secretary of state receives a registration form under division (B)(2)(b) or (c) of this section before the thirtieth day before an election, the board or the office of the secretary of state, as applicable, shall forward the registration to the board of elections of the county in which the applicant is seeking to register to vote within ten days after receiving the application. If a board of elections or the office of the secretary of state receives a 100 registration form under division (B)(2)(b) or (c) of this section 101 on or after the thirtieth day before an election, the board or the 102 office of the secretary of state, as applicable, shall forward the 103 registration to the board of elections of the county in which the 104 applicant is seeking to register to vote within thirty days after 105 that election. 106
- (C)(1) A board of elections that receives a voter 107 registration application and is satisfied as to the truth of the 108 statements made in the registration form shall register the 109 applicant not later than twenty business days after receiving the 110 application, unless that application is received during the thirty 111 days immediately preceding the day of an election. The board shall 112 promptly notify the applicant in writing of each of the following: 113

(a) The applicant's registration;	114
(b) The precinct in which the applicant is to vote;	115
(c) In bold type as follows:	116
"Voters must bring identification to the polls in order to	117
verify identity. Identification may include a current and valid	118
photo identification, a military identification, or a copy of a	119
current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck,	120
or other government document, other than this notification or a	121
notification of an election mailed by a board of elections, that	122
shows the voter's name and current address. Voters who do not	123
provide one of these documents will still be able to vote by	124
providing the last four digits of the voter's social security	125
number and by casting a provisional ballot. Voters who do not have	126
any of the above forms of identification, including a social	127
security number, will still be able to vote by signing an	128
affirmation swearing to the voter's identity under penalty of	129
election falsification and by casting a provisional ballot."	130
The notification shall be by nonforwardable mail. If the mail	131
is returned to the board, it shall investigate and cause the	132
notification to be delivered to the correct address.	133
(2) If, after investigating as required under division (C)(1)	134
of this section, the board is unable to verify the voter's correct	135
address, it shall cause the voter's name in the official	136
registration list and in the poll list or signature pollbook to be	137
marked to indicate that the voter's notification was returned to	138
the board.	139
At the first election at which a voter whose name has been so	140
marked appears to vote, the voter shall be required to provide	141
identification to the election officials and to vote by	142
provisional ballot under section 3505.181 of the Revised Code. If	143
the provisional ballot is counted pursuant to division (B)(3) of	144

under section 3505.183 of the Revised Code, the board shall	145
correct that voter's registration, if needed, and shall remove the	146
indication that the voter's notification was returned from that	147
voter's name on the official registration list and on the poll	148
list or signature pollbook. If the provisional ballot is not	149
counted pursuant to division $(B)(4)(a)(i)$, (v) , or (vi) of section	150
3505.183 of the Revised Code, the voter's registration shall be	151
canceled. The board shall notify the voter by United States mail	152
of the cancellation.	153
(3) If a notice of the disposition of an otherwise valid	154
registration application is sent by nonforwardable mail and is	155
returned undelivered, the person shall be registered as provided	156
in division (C)(2) of this section and sent a confirmation notice	157
by forwardable mail. If the person fails to respond to the	158
confirmation notice, update the person's registration, or vote by	159
provisional ballot as provided in division (C)(2) of this section	160
in any election during the period of two federal elections	161
subsequent to the mailing of the confirmation notice, the person's	162
registration shall be canceled.	163
Sec. 3505.181. (A) All of the following individuals shall be	164
permitted to cast a provisional ballot at an election:	165
(1) An individual who declares that the individual is a	166
registered voter in the jurisdiction in which the individual	167
desires to vote and that the individual is eligible to vote in an	168
election, but the name of the individual does not appear on the	169
official list of eligible voters for the polling place or an	170
election official asserts that the individual is not eligible to	171
vote;	172
(2) An individual who has a social security number and	173

provides to the election officials the last four digits of the

individual's social security number as permitted by division

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(A)(2) of section 3505.18 of the Revised Code;	176
(3) An individual who has but is unable to provide to the	177
election officials any of the forms of identification required	178
under division (A)(1) of section 3505.18 of the Revised Code and	179
who has a social security number but is unable to provide the last	180
four digits of the individual's social security number as	181
permitted under division (A)(2) of that section;	182
(4) An individual who does not have any of the forms of	183

Revised Code;	213
(10) An individual whose signature, in the opinion of the	214
precinct officers under section 3505.22 of the Revised Code, is	215
not that of the person who signed that name in the registration	216
forms;	217
(11) An individual who is challenged under section 3513.20 of	218
the Revised Code who refuses to make the statement required under	219
that section, who a majority of the precinct officials find lacks	220
any of the qualifications to make the individual a qualified	221
elector, or who a majority of the precinct officials find is not	222
affiliated with or a member of the political party whose ballot	223
the individual desires to vote;	224
(12) An individual who does not have any of the forms of	225
identification required under division (A)(1) of section 3505.18	226
of the Revised Code, who cannot provide the last four digits of	227
the individual's social security number under division (A)(2) of	228
that section because the person does not have a social security	229
number, and who declines to execute an affirmation as permitted	230
under division (A)(4) of that section;	231
(13) An individual who has but declines to provide to the	232
precinct election officials any of the forms of identification	233
required under division (A)(1) of section 3501.18 of the Revised	234
Code or who has a social security number but declines to provide	235
to the precinct election officials the last four digits of the	236
individual's social security number.	237

(B) An individual who is eligible to cast a provisional	238
ballot under division (A) of this section shall be permitted to	239
cast a provisional ballot as follows:	240
(1) An election official at the polling place shall notify	241
the individual that the individual may cast a provisional ballot	242
in that election.	243
(2) The individual shall be permitted to cast a provisional	244
ballot at that polling place upon the execution of a written	245
affirmation by the individual before an election official at the	246
polling place stating that the individual is both of the	247
following:	248
(a) A registered voter in the jurisdiction in which the	249
individual desires to vote;	250
(b) Eligible to vote in that election.	251
(3) The election official shall accurately complete the poll	252
worker checklist portion of the affirmation in the individual's	253
presence, including identifying the individual's correct precinct	254
if the individual is not voting in the correct precinct.	255
(4) An election official at the polling place shall transmit	256
the ballot cast by the individual, the voter information contained	257
in the written affirmation executed by the individual under	258
division (B)(2) of this section, or the individual's name if the	259
individual declines to execute such an affirmation to an	260
appropriate local election official for verification under	261
division (B) $\frac{(5)}{(5)}$ of this section.	262
$\frac{(4)}{(5)}$ If the appropriate local election official to whom the	263
ballot or voter or address information is transmitted under	264
division (B)(3) of this section determines that the individual is	265
eligible to vote, the individual's provisional ballot shall be	266
counted as a vote in that election.	267

$\frac{(5)(6)}{(6)}$ (a) At the time that an individual casts a provisional	268
ballot, the appropriate local election official shall give the	269
individual written information that states that any individual who	270
casts a provisional ballot will be able to ascertain under the	271
system established under division (B) $(5)(6)$ (b) of this section	272
whether the vote was counted, and, if the vote was not counted,	273
the reason that the vote was not counted.	274

(b) The appropriate state or local election official shall 275 establish a free access system, in the form of a toll-free 276 telephone number, that any individual who casts a provisional 277 ballot may access to discover whether the vote of that individual 278 was counted, and, if the vote was not counted, the reason that the 279 vote was not counted. The free access system established under 280 this division also shall provide to an individual whose 281 provisional ballot was not counted information explaining how that 282 individual may contact the board of elections to register to vote 283 or to resolve problems with the individual's voter registration. 284

The appropriate state or local election official shall
establish and maintain reasonable procedures necessary to protect
the security, confidentiality, and integrity of personal
information collected, stored, or otherwise used by the free
access system established under this division. Access to
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information about an individual ballot shall be restricted to the
individual who cast the ballot.

(6)(7) If, at the time that an individual casts a provisional 292 ballot, the individual provides identification in the form of a 293 current and valid photo identification, a military identification, 294 or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government 295 check, paycheck, or other government document, other than a notice 296 of an election mailed by a board of elections under section 297 3501.19 of the Revised Code or a notice of voter registration 298 mailed by a board of elections under section 3503.19 of the 299

Revised Code, that shows the individual's name and current	300
address, or provides the last four digits of the individual's	301
social security number, or executes an affirmation that the	302
elector does not have any of those forms of identification or the	303
last four digits of the individual's social security number	304
because the individual does not have a social security number, or	305
declines to execute such an affirmation, the appropriate local	306
election official shall record the type of whether identification	307
was provided, the social security number information, the fact	308
that the affirmation was executed, or the fact that the individual	309
declined to execute such an affirmation and include that	310
information with the transmission of the ballot or voter or	311
address information under division (B) $\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ of this section. If	312
the individual <u>does not provide identification and</u> declines to	313
execute such an affirmation, the appropriate local election	314
official shall record the individual's name and include that	315
information with the transmission of the ballot under division	316
$(B)\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ of this section.	317
$\frac{(7)(8)}{(8)}$ If an individual casts a provisional ballot pursuant	318
to division $(A)(3)$, (7) , (8) , (12) , or (13) of this section, the	319
election official shall indicate, on the provisional ballot	320
verification statement required under section 3505.182 of the	321
Revised Code, that the individual is required to provide	322
additional information to the board of elections or that an	323
application or challenge hearing has been postponed with respect	324
to the individual, such that additional information is required	325
for the board of elections to determine the eligibility of the	326
individual who cast the provisional ballot.	327

(8)(9) During the ten days after the day of an election, an 328 individual who casts a provisional ballot pursuant to division 329 (A)(3), (7), (12), or (13) of this section shall appear at the 330 office of the board of elections and provide to the board any 331

additional information necessary to determine the eligibility of	332
the individual who cast the provisional ballot.	333
(a) For a provisional ballot cast pursuant to division	334
(A)(3), (12), or (13) of this section to be eligible to be	335
counted, the individual who cast that ballot, within ten days	336
after the day of the election, shall do any of the following:	337
(i) Provide to the board of elections proof of the	338
individual's identity in the form of a current and valid photo	339
identification, a military identification, or a copy of a current	340
utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other	341
government document, other than a notice of an election mailed by	342
a board of elections under section 3501.19 of the Revised Code or	343
a notice of voter registration mailed by a board of elections	344
under section 3503.19 of the Revised Code, that shows the	345
individual's name and current address;	346
(ii) Provide to the board of elections the last four digits	347
of the individual's social security number;	348
(iii) In the case of a provisional ballot executed pursuant	349
to division (A)(12) of this section, execute an affirmation as	350
permitted under division (A)(4) of section 3505.18 of the Revised	351
Code.	352
(b) For a provisional ballot cast pursuant to division (A)(7)	353
of this section to be eligible to be counted, the individual who	354
cast that ballot, within ten days after the day of that election,	355
shall provide to the board of elections any identification or	356
other documentation required to be provided by the applicable	357
challenge questions asked of that individual under section 3505.20	358
of the Revised Code.	359
(C)(1) If an individual declares that the individual is	360
eligible to vote in a jurisdiction other than the jurisdiction in	361

which the individual desires to vote, or if, upon review of the

precinct voting location guide using the residential street	363
address provided by the individual, an election official at the	364
polling place at which the individual desires to vote determines	365
that the individual is not eligible to vote in that jurisdiction,	366
the election official shall direct the individual to the polling	367
place for the jurisdiction in which the individual appears to be	368
eligible to vote, explain that the individual may cast a	369
provisional ballot at the current location but the ballot will may	370
not be counted if it is cast in the wrong precinct, and provide	371
the telephone number of the board of elections in case the	372
individual has additional questions. The election official also	373
shall note, on the poll worker checklist portion of the	374
affirmation, that the election official directed the individual to	375
the correct precinct and the location of the individual's correct	376
precinct.	377
(2) If the individual refuses to travel to the polling place	378
for the correct jurisdiction or to the office of the board of	379
elections to cast a ballot, the individual shall be permitted to	380
vote a provisional ballot at that jurisdiction in accordance with	381
division (B) of this section. If any of the following apply, the	382
provisional ballot cast by that individual shall not be opened or	383
counted:	384

- (a) The individual is not properly registered in that 385 jurisdiction. 386
- (b) The individual is not eligible to vote in that election 387 in that jurisdiction. 388
- (c) The individual's eligibility to vote in that jurisdiction 389 in that election cannot be established upon examination of the 390 records on file with the board of elections. 391
- (D) The appropriate local election official shall cause 392 voting information to be publicly posted at each polling place on 393

the day of each election.	394

(d) Instructions for mail-in registrants and first-time	418

written affirmation, an individual casting a provisional ballot	591
may provide additional information to the election official to	592

Sec. 3505.183. (A) When the ballot boxes are delivered to the	599
board of elections from the precincts, the board shall separate	600
the provisional ballot envelopes from the rest of the ballots.	601
Teams of employees of the board consisting of one member of each	602
major political party shall place the sealed provisional ballot	603
envelopes in a secure location within the office of the board. The	604

sealed provisional ballot envelopes shall remain in that secure	605
location until the validity of those ballots is determined under	606
division (B) of this section. While the provisional ballot is	607
stored in that secure location, and prior to the counting of the	608
provisional ballots, if the board receives information regarding	609
the validity of a specific provisional ballot under division (B)	610
of this section, the board may note, on the sealed provisional	611
ballot envelope for that ballot, whether the ballot is valid and	612
entitled to be counted.	613

- (B)(1) To determine whether a provisional ballot is valid and 614 entitled to be counted, the board shall examine its records and 615 determine whether the individual who cast the provisional ballot 616 is registered and eligible to vote in the applicable election. The 617 board shall examine the information contained in the written 618 affirmation executed by the individual who cast the provisional 619 ballot under division (B)(2) of section 3505.181 of the Revised 620 Code. If the individual declines to execute such an affirmation, 621 the individual's name, written by either the individual or the 622 election official at the direction of the individual, shall be 623 included in a written affirmation in order for the provisional 624 ballot to be eligible to be counted; otherwise, the following 625 information shall be included in the written affirmation in order 626 for the provisional ballot to be eligible to be counted: 627
 - (a) The individual's name and signature;
- (b) A statement that the individual is a registered voter in 629 the jurisdiction in which the provisional ballot is being voted; 630

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- (c) A statement that the individual is eligible to vote in the election in which the provisional ballot is being voted.
- (2) In addition to the information required to be included in
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 an affirmation under division (B)(1) of this section, in
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 determining whether a provisional ballot is valid and entitled to
 635

be counted, the board also shall examine any additional	636
information for determining ballot validity provided by the	637
provisional voter on the affirmation, provided by the provisional	638
voter to an election official under section 3505.182 of the	639
Revised Code, or provided to the board of elections during the ten	640
days after the day of the election under division (B) $\frac{(8)}{(9)}$ of	641
section 3505.181 of the Revised Code, to assist the board in	642
determining the individual's eligibility to vote.	643
(3) If, in examining a provisional ballot affirmation and	644
additional information under divisions (B)(1) and (2) of this	645
section, the board determines that all of the following apply, the	646
provisional ballot envelope shall be opened, and the ballot shall	647
be placed in a ballot box to be counted:	648
(a) The individual named on the affirmation is properly	649
registered to vote.	650
(b) The individual named on the affirmation is eligible to	651
cast a ballot in the precinct and for the election in which the	652
individual cast the provisional ballot.	653
(c) The individual provided all of the information required	654
under division (B)(1) of this section in the affirmation that the	655
individual executed at the time the individual cast the	656
provisional ballot.	657
(d) If applicable, the individual provided any additional	658
information required under division (B) $\frac{(8)}{(9)}$ of section 3505.181	659
of the Revised Code within ten days after the day of the election.	660
(e) If applicable, the hearing conducted under division (B)	661
of section 3503.24 of the Revised Code after the day of the	662
election resulted in the individual's inclusion in the official	663
registration list.	664
(4)(a) If Except as otherwise provided in division (C) of	665

this section, if, in examining a provisional ballot affirmation

and additional information under divisions (D)(1) and (2) of this	667
and additional information under divisions (B)(1) and (2) of this	667
section, the board determines that any of the following applies,	668
the provisional ballot envelope shall not be opened, and the	669
ballot shall not be counted:	670
(i) The individual named on the affirmation is not qualified	671
or is not properly registered to vote.	672
(ii) The individual named on the affirmation is not eligible	673
to cast a ballot in the precinct or for the election in which the	674
individual cast the provisional ballot.	675
(iii) The individual did not provide all of the information	676
required under division (B)(1) of this section in the affirmation	677
that the individual executed at the time the individual cast the	678
provisional ballot.	679
(iv) The individual has already cast a ballot for the	680
election in which the individual cast the provisional ballot.	681
(v) If applicable, the individual did not provide any	682
additional information required under division (B) $\frac{(8)(9)}{(9)}$ of	683
section 3505.181 of the Revised Code within ten days after the day	684
of the election.	685
(vi) If applicable, the hearing conducted under division (B)	686
of section 3503.24 of the Revised Code after the day of the	687
election did not result in the individual's inclusion in the	688
official registration list.	689
(vii) The individual failed to provide a current and valid	690
photo identification, a military identification, a copy of a	691
current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck,	692
or other government document, other than a notice of an election	693
mailed by a board of elections under section 3501.19 of the	694
Revised Code or a notice of voter registration mailed by a board	695
of elections under section 3503.19 of the Revised Code, with the	696
voter's name and current address, or the last four digits of the	697

individual's social security number or to execute an affirmation	698
under division (A) of section 3505.18 or division (B) of section	699
3505.181 of the Revised Code.	700
(b) If, in examining a provisional ballot affirmation and	701
additional information under divisions (B)(1) and (2) of this	702
section, the board is unable to determine either of the following,	703
the provisional ballot envelope shall not be opened, and the	704
ballot shall not be counted:	705
(i) Whether the individual named on the affirmation is	706
qualified or properly registered to vote;	707
(ii) Whether the individual named on the affirmation is	708
eligible to cast a ballot in the precinct or for the election in	709
which the individual cast the provisional ballot.	710
(C)(1) If a provisional voter cast a ballot in a precinct in	711
which the provisional voter is not registered and eligible to vote	712
and the election officials failed to direct the provisional voter	713
to the correct precinct, the election officials shall remake that	714
provisional voter's ballot. The election official who signed the	715
poll worker checklist for that provisional voter shall be deemed	716
to have failed to direct the provisional voter to the correct	717
precinct if the election official did not complete that checklist	718
or did not correctly complete that checklist.	719
(2) A board of elections that remakes a provisional ballot	720
under division (C)(1) of this section shall remake the provisional	721
ballot on a ballot for the appropriate precinct to reflect the	722
offices, questions, and issues for which the provisional voter was	723
eligible to cast a ballot and for which the provisional voter	724
attempted to cast a provisional ballot. The remade ballot shall be	725
counted for each office, question, and issue for which the	726
provisional voter was eligible to vote.	727

(D)(1) For each provisional ballot rejected under division

(B)(4) of this section, the board shall record the name of the	729
provisional voter who cast the ballot, the identification number	730
of the provisional ballot envelope, the names of the election	731
officials who determined the validity of that ballot, the date and	732
time that the determination was made, and the reason that the	733
ballot was not counted.	734
(2) Provisional ballots that are rejected under division	735
(B)(4) of this section shall not be counted but shall be preserved	736
in their provisional ballot envelopes unopened until the time	737
provided by section 3505.31 of the Revised Code for the	738
destruction of all other ballots used at the election for which	739
ballots were provided, at which time they shall be destroyed.	740
$\frac{(D)}{(E)}$ Provisional ballots that the board determines are	741
eligible to be counted under division (B)(3) or (C) of this	742
section shall be counted in the same manner as provided for other	743
ballots under section 3505.27 of the Revised Code. No provisional	744
ballots shall be counted in a particular county until the board	745
determines the eligibility to be counted of all provisional	746
ballots cast in that county under division (B) of this section for	747
that election. Observers, as provided in section 3505.21 of the	748
Revised Code, may be present at all times that the board is	749
determining the eligibility of provisional ballots to be counted	750
and counting those provisional ballots determined to be eligible.	751
No person shall recklessly disclose the count or any portion of	752
the count of provisional ballots in such a manner as to jeopardize	753
the secrecy of any individual ballot.	754
$\frac{(E)(F)}{(F)}(1)$ Except as otherwise provided in division $\frac{(E)(F)}{(E)}(2)$	755
of this section, nothing in this section shall prevent a board of	756
elections from examining provisional ballot affirmations and	757
additional information under divisions (B)(1) and (2) of this	758
section to determine the eligibility of provisional ballots to be	759

counted during the ten days after the day of an election.

(2) A board of elections shall not examine the provisional	761
ballot affirmation and additional information under divisions	762
(B)(1) and (2) of this section of any provisional ballot for which	763
an election official has indicated under division (B) $\frac{(7)(8)}{(8)}$ of	764
section 3505.181 of the Revised Code that additional information	765
is required for the board of elections to determine the	766
eligibility of the individual who cast that provisional ballot	767
until the individual provides any information required under	768
division (B) $\frac{(8)}{(9)}$ of section 3505.181 of the Revised Code, until	769
any hearing required to be conducted under section 3503.24 of the	770
Revised Code with regard to the provisional voter is held, or	771
until the eleventh day after the day of the election, whichever is	772
earlier.	773

3505.182, and 3505.183 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	775
