To enact sections 193.01, 193.02, 193.03, and 193.04	1

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:					
Section 1. That sections 193.01, 193.02, 193.03, and 193.04	4				
of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:					
Sec. 193.01. (A) There is hereby created within the					
development services agency the Ohio economic council on women.					
The council shall consist of the following members:	8				
(1) Three members of the senate, two members appointed by the	9				
president of the senate and one member appointed by the minority	10				

qovernor not later than thirty days after the effective date of

this section.

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(2) Each member of the council appointed pursuant to division	42
(A)(1) or (2) of this section shall hold office during the general	43
assembly in which the member is appointed and until a successor	44
has been appointed, notwithstanding the adjournment sine die of	45
the general assembly in which the member was appointed or the	46
expiration of the member's term as a member of the general	47
assembly. Any vacancies occurring among these members of the	48
council shall be filled in the manner of the original appointment.	49
(3) Council members appointed under divisions (A)(3) to (6)	50
of this section serve until the council dissolves under division	51
(G) of this section. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment	52
pursuant to the criteria in this section.	53
(4) At all times, at least one member of the council	54
appointed pursuant to division (A) of this section shall be an	55
owner, chief executive officer, board member, or other managerial	56
employee who performs a substantial role in the decision-making	57
and the day-to-day operations of a sole proprietorship, a	58
corporation for profit, or a pass-through entity as defined in	59
section 5733.04 of the Revised Code.	60
(5) At all times, at least eight members of the council	61
appointed pursuant to division (A) of this section shall be women.	62
(C) The council shall elect at the first regular meeting of	63
each calendar year a chair, a vice-chair, and three	64
representatives, who comprise the five-member executive committee	65
to function between quarterly meetings. The chair or the director	66
of development services may call meetings of the executive	67
committee. The executive committee shall carry out the matters	68
delegated to it by the council.	69
(D) The council shall meet as necessary to transact business,	70
provided that the council shall meet at least quarterly.	71
Additional meetings may be called by the chair or by three members	72

of the council upon delivery of written notice to each member of					
the council. The director shall notify all members of the time and					
place of any regular or special meeting at least seven days in					
advance of that meeting.	76				
(E) A majority of council members shall constitute a quorum.	77				
The concurrence of a majority of those members present and voting	78				
in any matter within the council's duties is required for a	79				
determination of matters within the council's jurisdiction.	80				
(F) Council members shall receive no compensation but shall	81				
be reimbursed by the development services agency for actual and	82				
necessary expenses incurred in the performance of council duties.	83

examine the economic concerns and needs of women in Ohio,	88				
including employment policies and practices, educational needs and	89				
opportunities, child care, property rights, health care, domestic	90

address these concerns and needs, the council may conduct	92				
research, hold hearings, develop recommendations and policy,	93				
educate the public, and engage in activities for the benefit of	94

(1) Consult with and report to the governor, the general	97				
assembly, and the pertinent agencies, departments, boards,	98
