Such salary may be paid monthly out of the general county 1005 fund or out of the county's share of the fund derived from the 1006 receipts from motor vehicle licenses, as distributed by section 1007 4501.04 of the Revised Code, and the county's share of the fund 1008 derived from the motor vehicle fuel tax, as distributed by section 1009 5735.27 of the Revised Code, as the board of county commissioners 1010 directs, upon the warrant of the county auditor and shall be in 1011 lieu of all fees, costs, per diem or other allowances, and other 1012 perquisites, of whatever kind, which any engineer collects and 1013 receives. The engineer shall be the county tax map draftperson, 1014 but shall receive no additional compensation for performing the 1015 duties of that position. When the engineer performs service in 1016 connection with ditches or drainage works, the engineer shall 1017 charge and collect the per diem allowances or other fees provided 1018 by law and shall pay all of those allowances and fees, monthly, 1019 into the county treasury to the credit of the general county fund. 1020 The engineer shall pay into the county treasury all allowances and 1021 fees collected when the engineer performs services under sections 1022 315.28 to 315.34 of the Revised Code. 1023

(B) A county engineer may elect to engage or not to engage in 1024 the private practice of engineering or surveying before the 1025 commencement of each new term of office, and a county engineer who 1026 elects not to engage in the private practice of engineering or 1027 surveying may, for a period of six months after taking office, 1028 engage in the private practice of engineering or surveying for the 1029
