INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

To amend sections 131.44, 5747.01, and 5747.02 of the Revised Code to reduce income taxes by the amount of additional revenue generated by a state sales tax rate above 5%, to increase tax-deductibility of unreimbursed medical expenses, and to expressly incorporate favorable tax treatment of new health savings accounts.

H. B. No. 380-Representatives Grendell, Distel.

To amend sections 5739.01, 5739.033, and 5739.17 of the Revised Code to exempt snow removal from the sales tax.
