The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 21, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Raga was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 1-Representative T. Patton.

To amend sections 122.151, 122.152, 122.154, 166.01, 166.02, 166.08, 166.11, 166.13, 166.14, 166.16, 5733.98, and 5747.98 and to enact sections 166.17 to 166.21, 184.04, 5733.352, and 5747.331 to increase the maximum amount of technology investments eligible for a tax credit, to require signatures on technology investment tax credit certificates, to require the Director of Development to develop the form of the tax credit certificate, to require the Director to report information regarding tax credit certificates to the Tax Commissioner, to increase Edison Center application fees, to create the Ohio Research Commercialization Grant Program, to increase the maximum amount of obligations that may be issued to fund economic development programs, to create the Research and Development Loan Fund, to authorize the Director to make loans from the Research and Development Loan Fund, and to grant tax credits for qualified research and development loan payments.

H. B. No. 2-Representative C. Evans.

To direct that the General Assembly's ongoing efforts to improve the quality of teaching in Ohio include provisions recommended by the Governor's Commission on Teaching Success.

H. B. No. 3-Representative Schlichter.

To direct the General Assembly's deliberations to modify the state public school accountability system.

H. B. No. 4-Representative Wagner.

To amend sections 313.12, 2108.50, 2151.421, 2311.14, 2903.16, 5123.51, 5123.61, 5123.99, 5126.30, 5126.31, and 5126.33 and to enact sections

2152.821, 2903.341, 2945.482, 2945.491, 5123.084, 5123.511, and 5126.282 of the Revised Code to implement the recommendations of the MR/DD Victims of Crime Task Force.

H. B. No. 5-Representative Walcher.

To amend sections 2152.82, 2152.83, 2152.84, 2152.85, 2929.13, 2929.19, 2929.21, 2950.01, 2950.02, 2950.03, 2950.04, 2950.05, 2950.06, 2950.07, 2950.08, 2950.081, 2950.09, 2950.10, 2950.11, 2950.12, 2950.13, and 2950.99 and to enact section 2950.111 of the Revised Code to modify the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Law by adopting most of the recommendations of the Governor's Sex Offender Registration and Notification Task Force, generally conforming the Law to federal guidelines, providing a penalty for failing to send a notice of intent to reside, clarifying that habitual sex offenders in another jurisdiction are habitual sex offenders under Ohio law, clarifying the Law's community notification provisions as applied to multi-resident buildings, specifying that convictions in courts of foreign nations are sexually oriented offenses under the Law, and making other changes in that Law, and to amend the versions of sections 2929.13 and 2929.19 of the Revised Code that are scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2004, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

H. B. No. 6-Representative J. Stewart.

To direct the General Assembly in its deliberations regarding bioterrorism.

H. B. No. 7-Representative Taylor.

To amend sections 1701.831, 1707.01, 1707.08, 1707.09, 1707.11, 1707.23, 1707.40, 1707.41, 1707.42, 1707.43, 1707.44, and 2913.02 and to enact sections 1707.131 and 1707.231 of the Revised Code to modify the Corporation Law regarding special meetings of shareholders in connection with tender offer, control share acquisition bids; to modify the Securities Law with respect to securities to which it applies, requirements for registration of securities, the designation of the Secretary of State to receive service of process, the application of remedies under the Securities Law, the Attorney General's enforcement authority on behalf of persons injured by a violation, the statutes of limitations governing an action for specified violations, and the prohibitions against certain misleading actions; and to increase the criminal penalty for certain theft offenses and create a new criminal aggravated theft offense.

Said bills were considered the first time.

The following joint resolution was introduced:

H. J. R. No. 2-Representative Raussen.

Proposing to enact Section 2p of Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio relating to science and technology based research and development purposes, including authorizing the issuance of general obligations of the state to pay costs related to those purposes.

Said joint resolution was considered the first time.
