INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 8-Representative Fessler.

To amend sections 2151.421, 5104.011, 5104.02, 5104.03, 5104.04, 5104.10, and 5104.99 and to enact sections 5104.041 and 5104.14 of the Revised Code to modify the laws pertaining to the licensing of child day-care providers.

H. B. No. 9-Representatives Grendell, Calvert, Callender, Faber, Fessler, Hollister, T. Patton, Schaffer, Webster, Williams, Allen, Carano, Chandler, Domenick, Harwood, Miller, S. Patton, S. Smith, Woodard.

To enact section 101.18 of the Revised Code to establish toll-free telephone access to the offices of General Assembly members.

H. B. No. 10-Representative Redfern.

To enact section 3345.02 of the Revised Code to establish a limit on the annual increase in undergraduate in-state instructional and general fees that a state-assisted university or college board of trustees may charge.

To enact sections 2919.223, 2919.224, 2919.225, and 2919.226 of the Revised Code to create the offenses of misrepresentation by a child day-care provider and failure to disclose the death or serious injury of a child.

To amend sections 1547.69, 2911.21, 2913.02, 2921.13, 2923.12, 2923.121, 2923.123, 2923.16, 2929.14, 2953.32, and 4749.10 and to enact sections 109.731, 311.41, 311.42, 2923.124, 2923.125, 2923.126, 2923.127, 2923.128, 2923.129, 2923.1210, 2923.1211, and 2923.1212 of the Revised Code to authorize county sheriffs to issue licenses to carry concealed handguns to certain persons, to create the offenses of falsification to obtain a concealed handgun license, falsification of a concealed handgun license, and possessing a revoked or suspended concealed handgun license, to increase the penalty for theft of a firearm, and to maintain the provisions of this act on and after January 1, 2004, by amending the version of section 2929.14 of the Revised Code that takes effect on that date.

To enact sections 323.65, 323.66, 323.661, 323.662, 323.663, 323.664, 323.665, and 323.666 of the Revised Code to authorize an expedited procedure for foreclosing liens for long-delinquent property taxes.

H. B. No. 14-Representatives Miller, Ujvagi, Domenick, Allen, DeBose, Sferra, Seaver, S. Smith, Jerse, Skindell, Cirelli, Harwood.

To amend section 4719.99 and to enact sections 4719.25 to 4719.32 of the Revised Code to prohibit a telephone solicitor or salesperson from making an unsolicited telephone solicitation to a telephone number more than thirty days after the number appears on a no telephone solicitation registry to be developed, operated, and maintained by the Attorney General and to provide for enforcement by the Attorney General.

H. B. No. 15-Representatives Miller, Ujvagi, Domenick, Allen, Sferra, Skindell.

To enact sections 125.112 and 153.592 of the Revised Code to require firms that contract with the state to supply goods, render services, or construct public improvements, to implement the MacBride Principles of Fair Employment with respect to their business activities in Northern Ireland.

H. B. No. 16-Representatives Miller, McGregor, Carano, DePiero, Ujvagi, Domenick, Allen, Koziura, DeBose, Sferra, S. Smith, Jerse, Skindell, Cirelli, Harwood.

To amend sections 323.152 and 4503.065 of the Revised Code to increase the reduction in taxable value of property eligible for the homestead exemption and to require the Tax Commissioner to round homestead exemption inflation adjustments to the nearest multiple of ten dollars.

H. B. No. 17-Representatives Miller, Carano, Ujvagi, Domenick, Allen, Sferra, Skindell, Cirelli, Harwood.

To amend section 5747.98 and to enact section 5747.71 of the Revised Code to grant a state earned income tax credit equal to 20 per cent of the federal earned income tax credit.

H. B. No. 18-Representatives Miller, Carano, Ujvagi, Domenick, Allen, Sferra, Skindell.

To amend sections 4507.021, 4511.98, 4513.03, and 5501.27 of the Revised Code to authorize the Department of Transportation or the local authority with jurisdiction over road construction to require that vehicles display lighted lights within the construction zone during the hours of actual work within the zone, to assess one point against an offender's driving record for a violation of the requirement to display lights, in addition to the criminal penalty, and to amend the versions of sections 4510.036 and 4513.03 of the Revised Code that are scheduled to take effect January 1, 2004, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

H. B. No. 19-Representatives Miller, Ujvagi, Domenick, Allen, Sferra, S. Smith, Skindell, Cirelli.

To require the Department of Education to establish a pilot project to implement and evaluate the effectiveness of the "Heart 'E' Heart" healthy lifestyle curriculum in selected classrooms in grades one, two, and three and to make an appropriation.
