The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 21, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Flowers was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 27-Representatives Cirelli, Ujvagi, Price, Allen.

To enact section 3701.2410 of the Revised Code to require physicians to offer pregnant women the opportunity to have HIV testing and counseling.

H. B. No. 28-Representatives Jerse, Sferra, Hartnett, Jolivette, Brown, Miller, Redfern.

To amend section 2923.11 of the Revised Code to expand the definition of "firearm."

H. B. No. 29-Representatives Jerse, McGregor, Widowfield, Hartnett, Miller, DePiero, Sferra, Perry, S. Patton, Willamowski, D. Stewart, Husted, J. Stewart, Jolivette, Seitz, Core, Williams, Grendell, Redfern.

To amend section 2335.28 of the Revised Code to eliminate the four-day maximum on the amount of jury fees that are taxed as costs in a civil action.

H. B. No. 30-Representatives Williams, Kearns, Calvert, Flowers.

To amend sections 4521.01, 4521.02, and 4521.10 of the Revised Code to permit a local authority to consider for purposes of the Local Noncriminal Parking Law a fine of up to \$500 for a violation of an ordinance, resolution, or regulation that regulates the standing or parking of a vehicle in a disability parking space, and to provide that if a person fails to pay a fine for such a violation and the fine exceeds \$100 that person may not be permitted to register a motor vehicle in that person's name.

To amend sections 4503.181, 4503.19, 4503.21, 4503.23, and 4549.10 and to enact section 4503.192 of the Revised Code to require that motor vehicles carry only one license plate, to be displayed on the rear of the vehicle.

H. B. No. 32-Representatives Williams, Calvert, Allen, Willamowski, Widowfield, Carano, Otterman, Schaffer, Schmidt.

To amend section 145.011 of the Revised Code to move nonteaching employees of The University of Akron from the School Employees Retirement System to the Public Employees Retirement System.

H. B. No. 33-Representatives Olman, Callender, Miller, Peterson, Ujvagi, Allen, Hartnett, Jerse, Hollister, Boccieri, Perry, S. Patton, D. Stewart, Oelslager, Chandler, Brown, Yates, Carano, Kearns, Strahorn, S. Smith, Koziura, Driehaus, DePiero, Cirelli, Harwood.

To amend sections 1739.05, 1751.01, and 3923.51, to enact new section 3923.28 and section 3923.281, and to repeal sections 3923.28, 3923.29, and 3923.30 of the Revised Code to prohibit discrimination in health care policies, contracts, and agreements in the coverage provided for the diagnosis, care, and treatment of mental illness and substance abuse or addiction.

H. B. No. 34-Representatives Willamowski, Allen, Webster.

To enact section 5149.031 of the Revised Code to prohibit employees of the Adult Parole Authority from being required to use or using private vehicles during the course of their employment.

H. B. No. 35-Representatives Willamowski, Seitz, Schaffer, Faber, Oelslager, Allen, Seaver, Webster, Perry, Fessler, Callender.

To amend sections 5739.02 and 5739.05 of the Revised Code to provide a nine-day period in August each year during which sales of clothing and footwear are exempt from the sales and use tax.

H. B. No. 36-Representative Willamowski.

To amend section 3105.18 and to enact section 3105.73 of the Revised Code relative to the award of attorney's fees and litigation expenses in certain domestic relations cases.

H. B. No. 37-Representatives Willamowski, McGregor, Seitz, Schaffer, Seaver, Williams, Driehaus.

To amend sections 2913.02 and 2929.14 of the Revised Code to increase the penalty for theft of a firearm and to amend the version of section 2929.14

of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2004, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that date.

H. B. No. 38-Representatives Willamowski, Hagan, McGregor, Seitz, Setzer, Schaffer, Buehrer.

To amend section 4165.02 of the Revised Code to make the performance of a service for compensation without a required license, certificate, permit, or registration a deceptive trade practice and to create a civil cause of action for injunctive relief and damages under the Deceptive Trade Practices Law against a person who performs a service without a required license, certificate, permit, or registration.

To amend section 2950.09 of the Revised Code to expand the victim and community notification provisions of the SORN Law.
