INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 76-Representatives Widowfield, Williams, Jolivette, McGregor, Gilb, C. Evans, Schaffer, Miller, Allen, Otterman, Strahorn, Ujvagi.

To enact section 3701.62 of the Revised Code to establish the Shaken Baby Syndrome Education and Prevention Program.

H. B. No. 77-Representative DeWine.

To amend sections 9.41, 124.01, 124.11, 124.271, 124.34, 124.38, 124.40, 124.57, 124.60, 124.64, 135.22, 149.43, 2151.011, 3311.10, 3311.19, 3311.52, 3311.72, 3313.208, 3313.209, 3313.48, 3313.53, 3313.533, 3313.62, 3313.641, 3313.646, 3313.68, 3313.713, 3313.975, 3315.17, 3316.07,

3317.01, 3317.02, 3317.023, 3317.029, 3317.0212, 3317.03, 3317.16, 3319.02, 3319.03, 3319.07, 3319.071, 3319.081, 3319.082, 3319.083, 3319.088, 3319.12, 3319.181, 3319.36, 3327.01, 3327.011, 3329.06, 3329.08, and 5705.41; to enact new sections 3313.481 and 3317.11 and sections 3313.681, 3323.013, and 4511.765; and to repeal sections 124.011, 124.54, 3301.078, 3301.0719, 3301.0724, 3313.174, 3313.481, 3313.482, 3313.82, 3313.83, 3313.94, 3317.11, and 3319.06 of the Revised Code to require that schools under the control of school district boards of education be open for instruction for a specified number of hours each school year, to eliminate certain spending requirements for Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid moneys paid to school districts, to change the method of payment of special education weights for handicapped students attending joint vocational school districts, to eliminate the requirement that city school districts be subject to the state Civil Service Law, and to make other changes in the administration of the public school system.

To amend section 2117.06 of the Revised Code to require the state or any political subdivision of the state to present all claims against an estate within one year after the death of the decedent.

To amend section 101.27 of the Revised Code to eliminate the cost of living adjustments scheduled to be made in calendar years 2005 through 2008 to the compensation of members and officers of the General Assembly.

H. B. No. 80-Representatives Core, Gibbs, Hollister, Hagan, McGregor, Fessler, Calvert, Setzer, Schaffer, Allen, S. Smith.

To enact sections 2925.031, 2925.042, 2925.071, and 2925.111 of the Revised Code to prohibit the possession, sale, transportation, and cultivation of spores or mycelium capable of producing mushrooms that contain psilocin or psilocybin.

To amend section 1724.10 of the Revised Code to specify that a community improvement corporation designated as the agency of a political subdivision may be authorized to take certain other actions on behalf of the political subdivision and retains certain statutory powers to do all things necessary or convenient to carry out its organizational purposes.

To amend section 2313.16 of the Revised Code to permit a person who is 70 years of age or older to be excused from jury duty.

H. B. No. 83-Representatives DePiero, Redfern, Bocchieri, Willamowski, Carano, Flowers, Harwood, Hollister, Young, Seaver, Ujvagi, Allen, Sferra, Jerse, Book, Brown, Schaffer.

To amend sections 2903.06, 2903.08, and 4507.16 of the Revised Code to modify the offenses of aggravated vehicular homicide and aggravated vehicular assault and to amend the version of sections 2903.06 and 2903.08 of the Revised Code that are scheduled to take effect January 1, 2004, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

H. B. No. 84-Representative DePiero.

To amend sections 2945.38, 2945.40, 2950.13, 5122.011, 5122.05, 5122.15, and 5122.38 and to enact sections 5122.50, 5122.51, 5122.52, 5122.53, 5122.54, 5122.55, 5122.56, and 5122.57 of the Revised Code to authorize the civil commitment of certain sexually aberrant persons.

H. B. No. 85-Representatives Raussen, Raga, Wagner, McGregor, Kearns, Husted, Ujvagi, Allen, Schneider.

To amend sections 307.051, 307.055, 505.37, 505.375, 505.72, 4503.49, 4513.263, 4766.01, 4766.02, 4766.03, 4766.04, 4766.05, 4766.06, 4766.07, 4766.08, 4766.09, 4766.10, 4766.11, 4766.12, 4766.13, and 5503.12 and to enact sections 4766.15, 4766.17, and 4766.20 of the Revised Code to authorize the Ohio Ambulance Licensing Board to license commercial medical service organizations that operate ambulette vehicles for the transportation of persons who require the use of a wheelchair and air medical service organizations that operate air medical transportation, to add four members to the Board, to rename the Board the Ohio Medical Transportation Board, and to amend the version of section 4513.263 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2004, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

To amend sections 5104.01, 5104.04, 5104.30, 5104.32, 5104.34, 5104.35, 5104.38, 5104.39, 5139.41, 5739.031, 5739.032, 5739.12, 5739.122, 5739.21, 5741.03, 5741.12, and 5741.121 and to enact sections 107.31, 107.32, 5101.31, and 5104.382 of the Revised Code to make program and budgetary modifications, to establish provisions regarding the possible closing of state institutional facilities for the purpose of expenditure reductions or budget cuts, to amend the versions of sections 5739.031, 5739.12, and 5741.12 of the Revised Code that are scheduled to take effect July 1, 2003, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date, to amend Section 125 of Am. Sub. H.B. 94 of the 124th General Assembly, as subsequently amended, to amend Section 142 of Am. Sub. H.B. 94 of the 124th General Assembly, and to make an appropriation.
