INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 444-Representative J. Stewart.

To enact section 1531.151 of the Revised Code to require the Chief of the Division of Wildlife in the Department of Natural Resources to adopt rules establishing a bounty program for coyotes.

H. B. No. 445-Representatives Trakas, Seitz, Gilb.

To amend section 117.19 and to enact section 121.35 of the Revised Code to require that the Departments of Job and Family Services, Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities, Mental Health, and Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services and other departments implement procedures for accepting private accreditation for purposes of licensing and certifying facilities, programs, and services and to require that the departments accept financial audits completed in accordance with governmental auditing standards established by the Auditor of State.

Said bills were considered the first time.
