INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 182-Representatives Flowers, Allen, Aslanides, Collier, D. Evans, Hagan, Hollister, McGregor, Schaffer, Schmidt, Seitz, Strahorn, Wagner, White, Wolpert.

To amend sections 2305.234, 3701.071, 4715.42, and 4731.295 of the Revised Code to extend immunity from liability for services provided by volunteer health care professionals and workers to more health care facilities and to nonprofit referring organizations, to increase the maximum allowable income of individuals who may be served by volunteers having immunity from liability, and to amend the version of section 2305.234 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2004, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

H. B. No. 183-Representatives Daniels, Allen, C. Evans, Seitz, Setzer, Raga, Ujvagi.

To amend section 4123.01 and to enact sections 4125.01 to 4125.08 and 4125.99 of the Revised Code to register professional employer organizations for purposes of enforcing compliance with workers' compensation laws.

Said bills were considered the first time.
