- (3) The plaintiff was injured by an individual fleeing or eluding from a police officer or other law enforcement officer;
- (4) The plaintiff was injured by an individual operating a motor vehicle in violation of section 4511.19 of the Revised Code or any other state or local ordinance relating to the operation of a motor vehicle while under the

incluence of alcohol, a drug of abuse, or alcohol and a drug of abuse, or relating to operating a motor vehicle with a prohibited concentration of alcohol in the blood, breath, or urine;

- (5) The plaintiff was injured while operating the motor vehicle under the reasonable belief, which may be proven by clear and convincing evidence, of the existence of insurance or other coverage for the motor vehicle constituting proof of financial responsibility.
- (7) The plaintiff had insurance constituting proof of financial responsibility that lapsed while the plaintiff was in active service as a member of the armed forces of the United States or within six months after the plaintiff's discharge from active duty.""
