The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 239-Representatives Core, Seitz, McGregor, Kearns, Aslanides, Gilb, Hollister.

To amend sections 140.01 and 140.03, to enact new section 140.051, and to repeal section 140.051 of the Revised Code to expand the definition of costs of hospital facilities, to specify that a trustee, officer, or director of a hospital agency does not have an interest in the profits or benefits of an agreement between hospital agencies solely by virtue of being a trustee, officer, or director of one of the participating hospital agencies, and to confirm and validate amendments made to section 140.01 and the enactment of section 140.051 of the Revised Code by Am. Sub. S.B. 109 of the 113th General Assembly in order to eliminate any legal challenges that have been or may be raised concerning the constitutionality of these amendments.

H. B. No. 240-Representatives Strahorn, Allen, Barrett, Beatty, Bocchieri, Carano, Chandler, Cirelli, DeBose, Driehaus, Harwood, Jerse, Kearns, Key, Miller, Otterman, S. Patton, Perry, Price, Seaver, S. Smith, Ujvagi.

To amend sections 126.02 and 126.022 and to enact sections 117.53 and 126.04 of the Revised Code to require performance budgeting by most state agencies and to require performance audits of those agencies.

H. B. No. 241-Representatives Trakas, C. Evans, Kearns, Aslanides, Allen.

To enact section 3731.17 of the Revised Code to require the person with control of a hotel or single room occupancy facility to provide access to the hotel's or facility's guest registry, upon request, to any law enforcement officer who has a reasonable suspicion that a person engaged in criminal activity is staying in the hotel or facility.

Said bills were considered the first time.
