The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 21, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Raga was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 528-Representatives Koziura, Skindell, Yates.

To amend section 2923.126 of the Revised Code to remove the "locked motor vehicle" exception from the provision that otherwise exempts premises of a public or private institution of higher education from the right of a licensee to carry a concealed handgun; to list buildings, structures, parcels of land, and parking lots as examples of such premises; to remove the "private institution of higher education" exception from the provision that specifies that the Concealed Handgun Licensing Law does not negate or restrict a private employer's rule, policy, or practice concerning or prohibiting the presence of firearms on the employer's premises or property; and to specify that nothing in the Concealed Handgun Licensing Law limits, negates, restricts, or affects any right or authority of a peace officer to carry a concealed handgun.

H. B. No. 529-Representative Seitz.

To amend sections 1333.84, 1333.85, 4301.13, and 4301.24 of the Revised Code to revise the statutes governing the termination of manufacturers' franchise agreements with wine distributors, to eliminate the Liquor Control Commission's authority to set minimum mark-ups on wholesale wine sales and to fix minimum prices on wholesale wine sales, to prohibit volume and quantity discounting for the purpose of assisting the wholesale or retail sale of beer or intoxicating liquor, and to create the Wholesale Wine Distribution Study Committee.

Said bills were considered the first time.
