The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 21, the Assistant Clerk called the House to order.

Representative T. Patton was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 250-Representatives Seitz, Hartnett, Gilb, Seaver, Collier, Driehaus, Brinkman, Cirelli, Webster, Allen, McGregor, Otterman, Redfern, Carano, Skindell, Chandler, DePiero, Perry, Miller, Ujvagi, Strahorn, DeBose.

To amend sections 3301.01, 3301.03, 3301.04, 3301.05, 3301.06, 3301.08, and 3513.259, to enact new section 3301.02 and sections 3301.021 and 3301.051, and to repeal section 3301.02 of the Revised Code to change the voting membership of the State Board of Education to consist of a member from each of several electoral districts with boundaries coinciding with the state's Congressional districts and a president to be appointed by the Governor if there is an even number of such electoral districts, to provide for a fixed term of appointment for the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and to make changes in the procedure for meetings of the State Board of Education.

H. B. No. 251-Representatives Distel, Redfern.

To amend sections 2907.04, 2929.19, 2950.01, 2950.03, 2950.04, 2950.06, 2950.07, 2950.09, 2950.10, 2950.11, and 2950.13 of the Revised Code to make "unlawful sexual conduct with a minor" apply to a person 18 or older who engages in sexual conduct with a person who is under 18 and not the offender's spouse, to increase the penalties for the offense, and to specify that the offense is an aggravated sexually oriented offense for purposes of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Law, and to amend the version of section 2929.19 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2004, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

H. B. No. 252-Representative Cates.

To amend section 309.05 of the Revised Code to regulate when motions to dismiss and motions for summary judgment may be filed in actions to remove a prosecuting attorney.

Said bills were considered the first time.
