**INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bill was introduced:

**H. B. No. 540**-Representatives Reidelbach, Trakas, Wolpert, Fessler, McGregor, Webster, Hoops, Hollister, Latta, Clancy, Setzer, Kearns, Schaffer, Grendell, Strahorn, Perry, Chandler.

To amend sections 109.42, 737.11, 1901.18, 1901.19, 1907.18, 2919.27, 2919.271, 2923.124, and 2937.23 and to enact sections 2907.13, 2907.14, and 2907.141 of the Revised Code to allow a person who is a victim of a specified sexual offense to obtain either a criminal or civil protection order against the alleged offender.

Said bill was considered the first time.

On motion of Representative Kearns, the House adjourned until Thursday, August 12, 2004 at 11:00 o'clock a.m.
