The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Representative Flowers was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 546-Representative Grendell.

To amend sections 4510.037 and 4510.038 and to enact sections 4511.86 and 4511.861 of the Revised Code to provide that if a person is convicted of committing a state motor vehicle moving violation immediately after initiating a road rage incident, the moving violation is at least a fourth-degree misdemeanor and the court must fine the person at least \$100 and require the person to attend a road rage abatement seminar, and to require remedial driving courses to be taken in person.

H. B. No. 547-Representative Grendell.

To amend sections 311.171, 2717.01, 2950.03, 2950.05, 2950.10, 2950.11, 2950.13, and 5503.10 of the Revised Code to require that an application to a probate court for a change of name indicate whether the applicant is required to register for having committed a sex offense or child-victim oriented offense, to require that a person required to register for having committed a sex offense or child-victim oriented offense register any change of name, and to require that the state registry of sex offenders and child-victim offenders is accessible to law enforcement representatives through the LEADS system.

Said bills were considered the first time.
