The House met pursuant to adjournment.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 285-Representatives Grendell, Faber, Fessler, McGregor, Aslanides, Buehrer, Carano, Distel, Hartnett, Schmidt.

To amend section 5739.01 of the Revised Code to exempt from the sales tax motor vehicle towing service that is provided by an automobile club.

H. B. No. 286-Representatives Skindell, Cirelli, McGregor, Carano, Strahorn, Beatty, Barrett, C. Evans, Miller, D. Stewart, Perry, Jerse, Distel, Price, Domenick, Ujvagi, Key, Brown, Woodard, Driehaus, Mason, Koziura, Chandler, Hartnett, Yates, Book, Sykes, Harwood, S. To enact section 121.231 of the Revised Code generally to prohibit the award of state contracts and tax credits and the use of state moneys for loans, grants, or other assistance to expatriate corporations.

Proposing to amend Sections 2 and 11 of Article II and Section 12 of Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to lengthen the term of state representatives from two to four years and to prohibit state representatives and senators from serving more than three consecutive four-year terms.
