INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 29-Representatives Raussen, D. Evans, Distel, Aslanides, Allen, Raga, Driehaus, Trakas, Barrett, Daniels, Carano, McGregor, Reidelbach, Willamowski, Hartnett, Martin, Brinkman, Kearns, C. Evans.

To amend section 2919.251 of the Revised Code to require a court to consider certain factors before setting bail for a person if the person is charged with an offense of violence involving a victim who is a family or household member and to require the person to appear before the court before the court sets bail for that person.

H. B. No. 30-Representatives Reidelbach, Kearns, McGregor, Taylor, Trakas, Chandler, Combs, Setzer, Skindell, Allen, Carano, Barrett, Gilb, Strahorn, Otterman, Collier, C. Evans, Perry.

To enact section 3781.55 of the Revised Code to require any place of public accommodation to allow a mother to breast-feed within the place of public accommodation.

H. B. No. 31-Representatives Brown, Chandler, Healy, Hoops, Koziura, Miller, Skindell, Perry, Allen, Martin, Distel, Ujvagi, DeGeeter, Barrett, Reidelbach, Beatty, Driehaus, Raussen, S. Patton, Sykes, Harwood.

To amend sections 3509.02, 3509.03, 3509.04, and 3509.08 of the Revised Code to allow any qualified elector to vote by absent voter's ballots.

H. B. No. 32-Representatives Trakas, Fessler, Reidelbach, Peterson, Collier.

To enact sections 2919.221, 3301.561, and 5104.016 of the Revised Code to prohibit the administration of medication to a child in a child-care setting without authorization from the child's parents.

Said bills were considered the first time.
