**INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bill was introduced:

**H. B. No. 554**-Representatives Schlichter, Collier, Buehrer, Chandler, Fessler.

To amend sections 307.204 and 505.266 of the Revised Code to expand the notification requirements pertaining to concentrated animal feeding facilities by requiring applicable county and township officials to be notified regarding proposals for the establishment or certain expansions of any concentrated animal feeding facilities rather than only proposals involving major concentrated animal feeding facilities.

Said bill was considered the first time.
