## **INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bills were introduced:

**H. B. No. 555**-Representatives Oelslager, Book, Blessing, DeGeeter, Mason, Willamowski, Harwood, Bubp.

To enact section 2323.441 of the Revised Code to permit a subrogee to recover its subrogation interest against a third party that is liable to a claimant as a result of a civil action, subject to the right of the claimant to a defined portion of the net amount recovered.

To amend section 918.10 of the Revised Code to exempt nonprofit home delivered meals programs from the Meat and Poultry Inspection Law.

To amend section 4719.99 and to enact sections 4719.25, 4719.251, 4719.252, 4719.253, 4719.254, 4719.255, 4719.256, and 4719.257 of the Revised Code to prohibit making a political call without providing certain source identification, to prohibit initiating a political call that uses artificial or prerecorded voice messages to any telephone number that appears on a no-automated political call list to be developed, operated, and maintained by the Attorney General, and to provide for the act's enforcement by the Attorney General.

To amend section 4117.01 of the Revised Code to modify coverage of the Public Employees' Collective Bargaining Law with respect to township fire departments.
