INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 212-Representatives Carano, S. Patton, Boccieri.

To accelerate the effective date of county sales taxes submitted for voter approval at a special election held in May 2005 and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 213-Representatives Oelslager, Kearns, Carano, Healy, Hartnett, Ujvagi, Perry, Seaver, Garrison, Cassell, Mason, Chandler, Hughes, Skindell, Key.

To amend sections 3314.013 and 3314.17 and to enact section 3314.18 of the Revised Code to extend the statewide cap on the number of community schools sponsored by entities other than the school districts in which they would be located, to create the Joint Study Committee on Ohio's Community Schools, and to make changes to the Community Schools Law.

To amend section 2935.09 of the Revised Code to remove clerks of court from the procedures regarding the filing by private persons of affidavits alleging that a person committed a criminal offense.
